



**County Road 2 (Hennepin Avenue)  
Construction Update**



June 30, 2021

Construction changes on the Glencoe County Road 2 (Hennepin Avenue) project are taking place over the next couple of weeks.

Concrete Paving will continue on the 3 miles of County Road 2 from the Sibley County Line to Oak Leaf Road in Glencoe through the end of this week. Weather permitting the work should be done by this Friday. This portion of County Road 2 should remain closed through the end of July as crews finish driveway paving, shouldering and paint striping.

County Road 2 from Oak Leaf Road to 10th Street/Highway 22 has been closed to accommodate construction traffic and prepare for work next week. Folks can access their residence and city facilities on side streets ~~and~~ through 1st Street which will remain open to crossing (East/West) traffic. Residents living directly on County Road 2 can use the road via the shortest route from 10<sup>th</sup> Street or 1<sup>st</sup> Street. See attached access map.

Work next week includes pavement removal and paving. This work should be completed by the end of next week or by early the following week weather permitting. The county encourages everyone to find alternative routes whenever possible for the next couple of weeks, to follow signs and to give workers space during this temporary closure.

# COUNTY ROAD 2 (HENNEPIN AVE) CONSTRUCTION SOUTH GLENCOE & OAK LEAF PARK ACCESS MAP



CR 2 is closed to Thru Traffic from Sibley County to 10<sup>th</sup> Street due to a rehabilitation project.

Southbound traffic looking to access Oak Leaf Park and other neighborhoods south of the 212 bridge should go east on 10<sup>th</sup> Street East to Morningside (CR 15), then south to 1<sup>st</sup> Street (CR 33), then west to access the Park and neighborhoods. See map below. Northbound traffic should use opposite route.

Residents living directly on CR 2 can use the road via the shortest route from 10<sup>th</sup> Street or 1<sup>st</sup> Street. PLEASE look out for construction equipment and workers and obey law enforcement or construction personnel as directed.



Work is expected to be completed in 2-3 weeks. Thank you for your patience.
