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This letter is being sent to inform you of construction activity on the above-referenced project.

IF YOU ARE A LANDLORD, PLEASE SHARE THIS NEWSLETTER WITH YOUR RENTERS/TENANTS.

The contractor is tentatively scheduled to begin removals on the project either late this week or early next week. The removals will include sawcutting, milling, and removal of pavement and curb and gutter. You will still have access to your driveway at all times during this phase of the project. The phase of the project that includes the trail work from Oak Leaf Park to Hwy 212 is currently not scheduled to start until September.

The project includes mill and overlay, pavement reclamation and overlay, thin overlay, drain tile, concrete curb and gutter repairs, and turf restoration. See attached map for project locations. Most streets will remain open to traffic during construction of the project; however, we ask that you do not park on the street during the duration of the project. Work on the project is expected to take about 2 months to complete.

Large construction equipment has a lot of blind spots and it is hard to see everything or everyone. For your safety and the safety of the construction workers, we ask that if possible you avoid travel in areas of the project where construction crews and equipment are actively working. As the street construction work continues, there will be increased construction traffic as crews haul in concrete and other materials to the job site. This increased truck traffic will be noticed in the project area and the streets/highways directly adjacent to the project. Please encourage everyone in your neighborhood to make safety a priority.

Please remember that schedules can change at a moment's notice because of weather, delays by subcontractors, or other unforeseen events.
