1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Meeting was called to order by Mayor Voss at 7:00pm with all members present.

2. CONSENT AGENDA

A. Approve minutes of the regular meeting of August 15, 2022

Motion: Robeck, seconded by Neid to approve the consent agenda. All in favor, motion carried.

3. PUBLIC COMMENT (agenda items only)

Resident Ralph Aldrich – west pond is full of algae. City Administrator Larson said that they are currently working on mowing down all of the ponds.

4. PUBLIC HEARINGS

- A. Public Hearing on Ordinance 616 An Ordinance Amending Section 710 of Chapter 7 of the Glencoe City Code Regulating the Storage of Firearms
 - City Attorney Ostlund reviewed the suggested change amending Chapter 7, Section 710.
 - Mayor Voss opened the public hearing at 7:06pm.
 - Resident Clint Bell spoke in favor of the proposed change.
 - Resident James Keckle asked for clarification; does this ordinance apply to how you keep your firearms at home. Attorney Ostlund said that this ordinance is for what citizens do outside of their home but within the city.

Motion: Lemke, seconded by Neid to close the public hearing at 7:12pm. Vote 4 – 1 with Robeck against, motion carried.

B. 2nd Reading of Ordinance 616 - City Attorney Ostlund

Motion: Brinkmann, seconded by Lemke to approve the 2^{nd} Reading of Ordinance 616. Vote 4-1 with Robeck against, motion carries.

5. BIDS AND QUOTES

A. Supplemental Letter Agreement with SEH for Airport Terminal Building – Administrator Larson Independent Fee Estimate (IFE) – Becher Hoppe Associates, Inc.

Glencoe was awarded a \$712,500 grant to replace the terminal building at the airport. The share amount is \$38,500. 650 applications nationwide and the Glencoe Airport was awarded one out of four applications in Minnesota. Looking at awarding bid in late November.

Motion: Olson, seconded by Brinkmann to approve the architectural agreement with SEH. Vote 4 – 1 with Robeck against, motion carried.

B. Purchase of Used Squad Car from McLeod County Sheriff's Office for School Resource Officer – Chief Padilla

Motion: Olson, seconded by Robeck to approve purchasing a used squad car from McLeod County Sheriff's Office for School Resource Officer. Vote 4 – 1 with Robeck against, motion carried.

6. REQUESTS TO BE HEARD

A. Glencoe Police Department Policy Changes - Chief Padilla

MN Police Officers Standards and Training (POST) just adopted these policies and are requiring police departments to have identical or very similar policies.

1. Confidential Informants/Information Policy 3.17

Motion: Neid, seconded by Brinkmann to approve "Confidential Informants/Information Policy 3.17". All in favor, motion carried.

2. Avoiding Racial Profiling Policy 3.41

Motion: Lemke, seconded by Olson to approve "Avoiding Racial Profiling Policy 3.41". All in favor, motion carried.

B. Light and Power Commission Appointment – Administrator Larson

Three applications were received for the Light & Power Commission opening: Kevin Preis, Milan Alexander, Mike Drew. The commission recommends appointing Kevin Preis. Robeck stated that he thinks Milan Alexander would be better qualified and he thinks Kevin should wait until the opening at the beginning of next year.

Motion: Lemke, seconded by Olson to appoint Kevin Preis to the Light & Power Commission based on the commission's recommendation. Vote 3 – 2 with Robeck and Neid against, motion carries.

C. WAC/SAC Waiver Request from Glencoe Hotel Group, LLC – Administrator Larson Glencoe Hotel Group, LLC is requesting that the City waive the WAC/SAC charges for the 51 room Americann Hotel Project totaling \$82,150. EDC reviewed this request at it's August meeting and their recommendation is that if it is a cashflow issue to structure a payment plan such as 0% interest for 5 years. City Attorney Ostlund recommends that a policy should be put in place if the City is interested in looking at waiving fees.

Motion: Robeck, seconded by Neid to table for now. All in favor, motion carried.

Item 4A – Attached is the proposed Assessment Roll for the 2022 Pavement Project.

It is recommended to approve Resolution 2022-21 setting the Public Hearing for the Pavement Project for October 17th at 7:15 PM.

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-21 DECLARING COST TO BE ASSESSED, ORDERING PREPARATION OF PROPOSED ASSESSMENT, AND CALLING FOR HEARING ON PROPOSED ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, costs have been determined for the 2022 Pavement Improvement Project, for the construction of mill and overlay, pavement reclamation and overlay, thin overlay, drain tile, concrete curb and gutter repairs, turf restoration, and miscellaneous items required to complete the improvements, and the estimated final contract price for such improvements is \$1,041.523.90, and the estimated final expenses incurred or to be incurred in the making of such improvements amount to \$91,745.00, so that the estimated final total cost of the improvements will be \$1,133,268.90.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GLENCOE, MINNESOTA:

- 1. The portion of the cost of such improvement to be paid by the city is hereby declared to be \$975,340.94, and the portion of the cost to be assessed against benefited property owners is declared to be \$157,927.96.
- 2. Assessment shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 5 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2023, and shall bear interest at the rate of 2.00 percent per annum from the date of the adoption of the assessment resolution.
- 3. The City Administrator, with the assistance of the consulting engineer, shall forthwith calculate the proper amount to be specially assessed for such improvement against every assessable lot, piece or parcel of land within the district affected, without regard to cash valuation, as provided by law, and he shall file a copy of such proposed assessment in his office for public inspection.
- 4. A hearing shall be held on the 17th day of October, 2022, in the Glencoe City Hall at 7:15 p.m., to pass upon such proposed assessment and at such time and place all persons owning property affected by such improvement will be given an opportunity to be heard with reference to such assessment.
- 5. The City Administrator is hereby directed to cause a notice of the hearing on the proposed assessment to be published once in the official newspaper at least two weeks prior to the hearing, and shall state in the notice the total cost of the improvement. The City Administrator shall also cause mailed notice to be given to the owner of each parcel described in the assessment roll not less than two weeks prior to the hearing.
- 6. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the McLeod County Auditor-Treasurer, pay the whole of the assessment on such property with interest accrued to the date of payment, to the City Administrator, except that no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by November 17, 2022. He may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.

WHEREAS, The purpose of this section is to protect the public safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Glencoe and to prevent and abate unnecessary injury or death.

WHEREAS, It is the intent of the City of Glencoe by the adoption of this Section to regulate firearms in compliance with Minnesota State law.

The City Council of Glencoe, Minnesota ordains:

Section 1: Section 710 of Chapter 7 of the Glencoe Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

710.03. No person except a police officer in the performance of his duty shall, within the City of Glencoe, carry any gun, pistol, or firearm, of any description, unless it is dismounted or broken apart or carried in a case in such manner that it cannot be discharged. This subdivision shall not prevent the carrying of a hand gun within the City under a permit subject to the restrictions imposed by law.

710.11. It shall be unlawful for any parent or guardian of any person under the age of 18 years knowingly to permit such person to violate any provision of this Chapter.

Section 2. Repeal. Anything contrary language to the proposed amendment is hereby repealed upon the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.

ORDINANCE NO. 617

AN ORDINACE AMENDING SECTION 426 OF CHAPTER 4 OF THE GLENCOE CITY CODE REGARDING THE USE OF ALL TERRAIN VENICLES

Findings and Purpose:

WHEREAS, The purpose of this section is to protect the public safety, health and welfare of the citizens of the City of Glencoe and to prevent and abate unnecessary injury or death.

WHEREAS, It is the intent of the City of Glencoe by the adoption of this Section to regulate Utility Task Vehicles or Class 1 All-Terrain Vehicles in compliance with Minnesota State law.

The City Council of Glencoe, Minnesota ordains:

Section 1: Section 426 of Chapter 4 of the Glencoe Municipal Code is hereby amended as follows:

Section 426.01 (A)(4) <u>Permit Term</u>. Permits shall be granted for a term of <u>three calendar years from January 1 to December 31st</u> (regardless of what month the permit is issued) and must be renewed through an annual application and payment applicable permit fee payment pursuant to the requirements of this section.

Section 426.01 (A)(11) Compliance with Traffic and Motor Vehicle Laws. A permitted Driver or any person operating a Utility Task Vehicle or Class 1 All-Terrain Vehicle unlawfully without a permit under this section has all the rights and duties applicable to the driver of any other vehicle under the provisions of Minn. Stat. ch. 169, subd. 6, as it may be amended from time to time, except when these provisions cannot reasonably be applied and except as otherwise specifically provided in Minn. Stat. § 169.045, subd.7, as it may be amended. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a permitted Driver or any person operating a UTV or Class 1 ATV unlawfully without a permit shall at all time observe all Minnesota statutes and City ordinances applicable to traffic and motor vehicles, including but not limited to the following which shall be unlawful:

- a. At a rate of speed or rate of acceleration greater than reasonable or proper under all the surrounding circumstances and in no event at a rate of speed greater than the posted speed limit.
- b. In a careless, reckless, or negligent manner so as to endanger other persons or property.
- c. To tow anything including any person or object, unless the UTV or Class 1 ATV is towing a street legal trailer to or from the City's yard waste and/or compost facility.

- d. In a manner creating loud, unnecessary or unusual noise, or that otherwise disturbs or interferes with the peace and quiet of other persons.
- e. Without a headlight and taillight illuminating at all times, each of minimum candlepower as prescribed by rules of Commissioner of Public Safety.
- f. Without brakes conforming to standards prescribed by rule of the Commissioner.
- g. Without a rear-view mirror to provide the driver with adequate vision from behind as required by Minn. Stat. § 169.70.
- h. Without property functioning front turn signals, rear turn signals, front headlamps, rear headlamps, an electronically actuated horn, and a speedometer.
- i. To operate a ATV or UTV upon City right-of-way without complying with manufacturer's guidance on safe street operation, including but not limited to tires designed for street operation.
- j. To travel with a passenger(s) except as authorized by Minn. Stat. §84.9257(a) or (b).
- k. A permitted Driver or any person operating a Utility Task Vehicle or Class 1 All-Terrain Vehicle may use arm signals when practicable.
- 1. The signals herein required shall be given either by means of the hand and arm or by a signal lamp or signal device of a type approved by the commissioner of public safety, but when a vehicle is so constructed or loaded that a hand and arm signal would not be visible in normal sunlight, and at night both to the front and rear of such vehicle, then the signals must be given by such a lamp or device. When the signal is given by means of the hand and arm the driver shall indicate intention to start, stop, or turn by extending the hand and arm from and beyond the left side of the vehicle in the following manner and these signals shall indicate as follows:
 - i. left turn: hand and arm extended horizontally;
 - ii. right turn: hand and arm extended upward;
 - iii. stop or decrease speed: hand and arm extended downward.

Section 2. **Repeal.** Anything contrary language to the proposed amendment is hereby repealed upon the effective date of this ordinance.

Section 3. Effective Date. This ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.

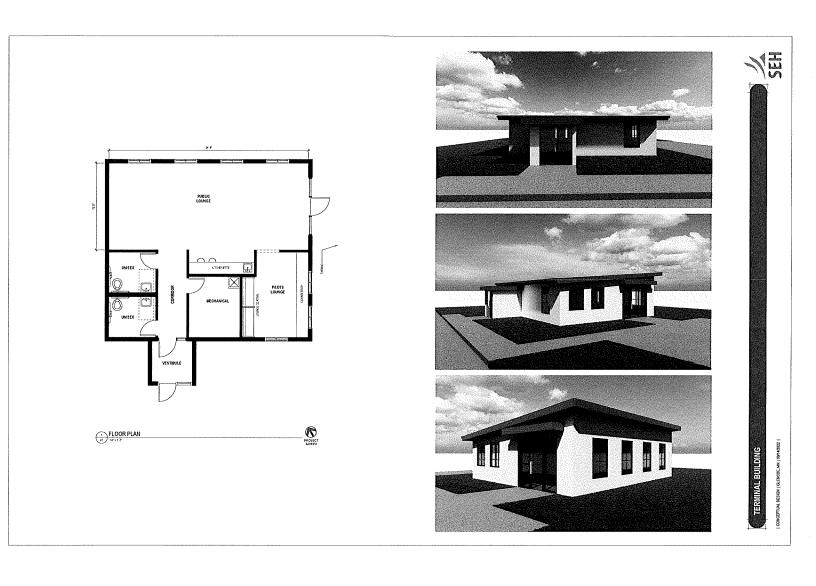

August was up slightly from last year +\$336. We were competing against Winstock week last year, so the sales numbers were good when you factor that in. Customer counts were up 40 transactions from last year, while item count was down 623 items. Average transaction size was down: \$26.98 compared to \$27.07 last year (Winstock factor).

- Beer sales were down a fraction -0.43%, with some fluctuation in sub-categories Domestics +1.2%, Imports +10.7%, Malt bev +14.1%, Craft -7.1%, and Seltzers -30.7%. Seltzers are down almost equal to the amount that Pre-mix in Liquor is up. Craft sales are a little concerning, so we'll try to boost with some promotions in September.
- Liquor sales were up +2.6%. Without Pre-Mix being up \$3k, Liquor would have been down as a category. Most of the other sub-categories were down, with only Irish (+31.3%), Scotch (+38.9%), and non-associated Whisky (+15.9%) being up. We will watch this closely as inflation continues to take hold.
- Wine sales were up a hair + 1.4%. Bubbly (+77.4%) and Sauvignon Blanc (+48.4%) were the only bigger increase categories, most others were flat or down. The wine sale that started at the end of the month gave sales a little boost.
- August promotions included the Clydesdale event at the City Center parking lot, along with some Facebook posts and in-store sale pricing. We closed out the month with the beginning of the Labor Day Wine Sale.
