### 1. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Meeting was called to order at 7:00pm with all members present.

### 2. APPROVE THE AGENDA

Motion: Neid, seconded by Lemke to approve the agenda. All in favor, motion carried.

- C. Special Event Security Bank and Trust Block Party August 29, 2023 close 11<sup>th</sup> Street between Greeley Avenue and Hennepin Avenue City Administrator Mark Larson noted that he received a call from Security Bank and the street will not be closed down, just the turn lane will be closed.

The statute states that the licenses will not even be in place until January 1, 2025. Resident Dave Stark stated his concerns and thinks the council should require that cannabis cannot be sold within 500 yards of a school or daycare.

Motion: Neid, seconded by Olson to close the public hearing at 7:17pm. All in favor, motion carried.

Motion: Neid, seconded by Hueser to approve Second Reading of Ordinance 622 prohibiting the use of Cannabis in Public Places or on Public Property. All in favor, motion carried.

A. Request for Additional Compensation due to Haul Route change – 2023 Pavement Project – Gary Harms, GMH Asphalt

Gary Harms, GMH Asphalt, has requested additional payment of \$55,990 for the 2023 Pavement Plan. Mr. Harms's request is due to County Road 41 in Chaska being closed, which has added 22 minutes round trip per truck.

Motion: Lemke, seconded by Neid to table the request. Vote 4 to 1 with Hueser voting against, motion carried.

B. Sealcoat and Crack Repair Quotes - PW Director Voigt

Motion: Lemke, seconded by Rivera to accept the quote from Bargan Incorporated for replay, sealcoat and crack repair on 10<sup>th</sup> St and the other crack repairs and chip seals that need to be done. All in favor, motion carried.





Item 6A – The City Council tabled the attached request of GMH Asphalt for additional compensation due to Highway 41 shut down in Chaska requiring him to adjust his haul route.

I have attached an email from City Attorney Ostlund with his legal advice on how to handle this request.

There was no official request from the City of Victoria for additional compensation. GMH was a subcontractor in that project and the Prime Contractor absorbed the additional costs which were estimated at less than \$5,000 on that contract.

Our previous discussion with the City of Waconia is that they were not going to approve a request.

City Engineer Brody Bratsch has estimated that the additional cost would be \$55,990 based upon the quantities that were bid. An Official Change order will be prepared and signed by both parties if approved.

It is my recommendation to deny this request.

I will just reiterate the counsel communicated on August 4<sup>th</sup> (see attached).

GMH is asking for a change proposal to adjust all bituminous tons by \$2.75 in the contract. Here is the applicable contractual language (provided by SEH):

### SC-13.03 Unit Price Work

Delete Paragraph 13.03.E in its entirety and insert the following in its place:

E. The unit price of an item of Unit Price Work shall be subject to re-evaluation and adjustment under the following conditions:

- 1. if the extended price of a particular item of Unit Price Work amounts to 50 percent or more of the Contract Price (based on estimated quantities at the time of Contract formation) and the variation in the quantity of that particular item of Unit Price Work performed by Contractor differs by more than 50 percent from the estimated quantity of such item indicated in the Agreement; and
- 2. if there is no corresponding adjustment with respect to any other item of Work; and
- 3. if Contractor believes that Contractor has incurred additional expense as a result thereof; Contractor may submit a Change Proposal, or if Owner believes that the quantity variation entitles Owner to an adjustment in the unit price, Owner may make a claim, seeking an adjustment in the Contract Price.

According to the language above, the City and Contractor must re-evaluate and adjust a Unit Price if the unit price in question amounts to 50% or more of the Contract Price and the variation in quantity differs by more than 50% of the estimated quantity. It is my understanding that the \$2.75 increase to the Unit Price for bituminous does not constitute 50% or more of the Contract price and the adjustment does not amount to 50% of the estimated quantify under the Contract.

For that reason, the City is under no obligation to grant this change proposal. Granting change proposals on a permissive basis puts the City in a difficult position. The City's policy really needs to be (and I assume this has been the case) that any contractual changes which dictate the Contract Price need to be mandated under the contract, and that is not the case here. Otherwise, Contractors can strong arm the City into inflating the Contract Price.

### Mark,

Please see proposed traffic control plans dated 3/2/22 off plan set TC2. Highlighted in yellow please note that all traffic was to be fully open to traffic within 45 days. This shutdown was to be started in May of 2023 and be completed in early July. During the course of time, after the bid date, different scenarios for closures were implemented. This is confirmed by Matt Clark, City engineer for the city of Chaska. (See June 28th email). The implementation of closing 41 to 5 ton traffic only resulted in extra ordinary detours for truck traffic. New detour changes were implemented 3/27/23, 4/28/23 and 5/1/23. GMH had no knowledge of these internal changes as did many others making their livelihood in the trucking industry. Due to the above detours, the project is now set in place to highway 41 in downtown Chaska closed until 11/1/23. This date is well beyond the time given to GMH to complete the Glencoe project. GMH purchases its bituminous from Martin Marietta asphalt plant in Chaska, GMH is a high volume contractor with Martin Marietta and therefore receives large discounts to compete with outside competition. These discounts were passed onto the Glencoe project as bid. Trucking from the plant in Chaska was to go through Chaska north on 41 to HWY 212 and straight to Glencoe. With the onslaught of the 41 closure, GMH now must spend additional hours of trucking detouring southwest to Jordan to CO Rd 9, to Co Rd 50, to Co Rd 40, then to hwy 212. This round trip is taking an additional 22 minutes per load and costing GMH as additional 2.75 per ton in expense (\$135 truck cost/hr / 18 ton avg. per load / 60 min/hr x 22 mins). GMH gave a very competitive bid for the Glencoe Project and is asking for the City's help, as this would severely cut into the profitability to GMH. We are therefor requesting a change order increase of \$2.75 per ton added to all bituminous tons occurring on the project. We are only looking to cover the trucking costs. No markup is included in the \$2.75 per ton. GMH had no knowledge that 41 was to be closed after July 1st of the year as of the date of the Glencoe bid. We have also reached out to the City of Victoria and Waconia, where we also have projects, and they have agreed to work with us as well. We hope the City of Glencoe understands our dilemma and will in turn grant us this request.







Dear Mark:

Following up on our telephone conversation of August 24, 2023, I am setting forth in this letter the details, which you requested, as to why an Amendment of the Glencoe Hotel Group's Tax Abatement Business Subsidy Agreement with the City of Glencoe is required.

The hotel group encountered several serious impediments to completing this project as originally planned. Had things gone the way they were originally planned, this project would have been completed by the end of this month. Unfortunately, the group's selected lender was saddled with an overly conservative appraisal of the project resulting in inadequate funding.

The hotel group then selected a different lender who had their own appraisal, which, while being conservative, appears to be now workable with the addition of a secondary lender who will make up the shortfall in the money needed to complete the project. It is expected that both lenders will have comittments before the group within the next two or three weeks, allowing construction to start this fall.

Because of the delays, the hotel group requests that the substantial completion date set out in Section 2.2(4) be changed from August 31, 2023 to August 31, 2024. Similarly, Section 3.8(1), Tax Abatement Program, which specifies that the 15-year abatement period begin with real estate taxes payable in 2024 through 2038 be amended so that the payment dates begin April 1, 2025 and continue through April 1, 2039.

You should also know that some delay in the project resulted from delivery delays attributable to the pandemic and a stratospheric rise in lumber prices which has subsided.

The group not hopes to proceed shortly and the City's willingness to amend the agreement will ensure that the project can proceed. I thank you for your attention to this. If you need additional information, please let me know at your convenience. Thank you.

### **ORDINANCE 621**

### AN INTERIM ORDINANCE AUHTORIZING A STUDY AND IMPOSING A MORATORIUM ON THE OPERATION OF CANNABIS BUSINESSES IN THE CITY

The City Council of the City of Glencoe, McLeod County, State of Minnesota, does hereby ordain:

### SECTION 1. BACKGROUND.

- A. The Minnesota Legislature recently enacted, and the Governor signed, 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 H.F. No. 100 ("Act"), which is comprehensive legislation relating to Cannabis including, but not limited to, the establishment of the Office of Cannabis Management ("OCM"); legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products by adults; providing for the licensing, inspection, and regulation of Cannabis Businesses and hemp businesses; taxing the sale of cannabis flower, cannabis products, and certain hemp products; establishing grant and loan programs; amending criminal penalties; providing for expungement of certain convictions and providing for the temporary regulation of certain edible cannabinoid products.
- B. The Act requires that on or before October I, 2023, every person or entity selling edible cannabinoid products to consumers must register with the commissioner in a form and manner established by the commissioner. After October I, 2023, the sale of edible cannabinoid products by a person or entity that is not registered is prohibited.
- C. With respect to Cannabis Businesses, which, under the Act, does not include lower-potency hemp edible manufacturer or lower-potency hemp edible retailer, the Act provides local units of government certain authority related to Cannabis Businesses, including the authority to (I) require local registration of certain Cannabis Businesses operating retail establishments, (2) adopt reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, provided that such restrictions do not prohibit the establishment or operation of a Cannabis Businesses, (3) limit the number of certain Cannabis Businesses based on the population of the community, and (4) prohibit the operation of a Cannabis Businesses within 1,000 feet of a school, or 500 feet of a day care, residential treatment facility, or an attraction within a public park that is regularly used by minors, including a playground or athletic field.
- D. The Act requires the OCM, which will be established effective July I, 2023, to work with local governments to develop model ordinances for reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses. The Act also requires the OCM to establish additional rules and regulations relating to the operation of Cannabis Businesses. The City will benefit from reviewing and analyzing the OCM's model ordinances, rules and regulations before making any decisions related to the regulation of Cannabis Businesses in the City.
- E. Section 342.02 et. seq. established by the Act directs the OCM to make rules, establish policy and exercise its regulatory authority over both the cannabis industry, as well as the lower potency hemp products and the hemp consumer products.
- F. Section 342.06 established by the Act requires to OCM to create and approve product categories of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles, and hemp-derived consumer products for retail sale.
- G. Section 342.06 established by the Act requires the OCM to establish limits on the total THC allowed of cannabis flower, in cannabis products, and in hemp-derived consumer products and prohibits

approval of certain forms of cannabis product, lower-potency hemp edible, or hemp-derived consumer product.

- H. Section 342.07 established by the Act requires the OCM to establish certification, testing, and labeling requirements for the methods used to grow new cannabis plants or hemp plants, including but not limited to growth from seed, clone, cutting, or tissue culture.
- I. Section 342.07 established by the Act requires the OCM to establish best practices for: (I) the cultivation and preparation of cannabis plants; and (2) the use of pesticides, fertilizers, soil amendments, and plant amendments in relation to growing cannabis plants.
- J. Section 342.07 established by the Act requires the OCM to regulate businesses that manufacture, process, sell, handle, or store an edible cannabis product or lower-potency hemp edible and will require, for most of those businesses to obtain an edible cannabinoid product handler endorsement.
- K. Section 342.08 established by the Act requires the OCM to provide regulations establishing energy standards, disposal of waste and addressing odor.
- L. The Act amended Minnesota Statutes §340A.412, subd. 14 to allow, effective the day after the final enactment of the bill (the governor's signature), exclusive liquor stores to sell edible cannabinoid products as that term is defined in current statute, 151.72, subd. l.
- M. Section 342.13 established by the Act contains a provision that allows for a City Council that plans to conduct studies that has held or is considering adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of a cannabis business, to hold a hearing on and adopt an interim ordinance applicable to all or part of its jurisdiction for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens until January I, 2025. This provision only relates to the Cannabis Businesses, which does not include having the ability to study the lower potency hemp business or hemp consumer products, even though the newly created OCM will be issuing licenses related to the lower potency hemp products, as well as engaging in rule making related to both the lower potency hemp products and the hemp consumer products.
- N. Given the uncertainty regarding the model ordinances to be developed by the OCM and the broad scope of the changes to Minnesota law brought about by the Act, the City desires to adopt an interim ordinance for the purpose of protecting the planning process and the health, safety, and welfare of its citizens and to conduct a study for the purpose of considering the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses as well as the other regulations local units of government may adopt under the Act.
- O. On August 7, 2023, the City Council held a properly noticed public hearing regarding the consideration and adoption of an interim ordinance prohibiting the operation of Cannabis Businesses within the City for up to one year.

### SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS.

For purposes of this Ordinance, the following terms shall have the meaning given them in this section.

- (a) "Act" means 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 (H.F. No. 100).
- (b) "Cannabis Business" has the meaning given the term in Minnesota Statutes, section 342.01, subdivision 14.

- (c) "City" means the City of Glencoe, Minnesota.
- (d) "Edible Cannabinoid Product" has the meaning given the term in Minnesota Statutes, section 151.72, subdivision I(f).
- (e) "OCM" means the Office of Cannabis Management, established as set forth in Minnesota Statutes, section 342.02, subd. I.
- (f) "Ordinance" means this interim ordinance, which is adopted pursuant to Minnesota Statutes, section 462 and 342.13(e).

### SECTION 3. FINDINGS.

- A. The City Council finds there is a need to study (i) Cannabis Businesses and (ii) the impact of those businesses, as related to allowed land uses and zoning, in order to assess the necessity for and efficacy of regulation and restrictions in order to protect the public health, safety, and welfares of its residents.
- B. The study will allow the City Council to determine the appropriate changes, if any, that it should make to the City Code, including any necessary zoning changes.
- C. The time will allow for any state agency rulemaking related to licensing Cannabis Businesses; and to create its model ordinances which will further aid the Council in studying and considering restrictions on the operation of Cannabis Businesses and any changes to the City's current provisions related to THC Specialty Providers, identified as Lower Potency Hemp Businesses in the Act.
- D. The City Council therefore finds that there is a need to adopt a city-wide moratorium on Cannabis Businesses while City staff studies the issue.
- E. The City Council finds that ordinance 353 of the City Code remains in effect until otherwise preempted by the Act.

### SECTION 4. MORATORIUM.

- A. <u>Moratorium</u>. A moratorium is hereby imposed regarding the operation of a Cannabis Business within the City. During the term of this Ordinance, no business, person, or entity may establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the jurisdictional boundaries of the City. The City shall not accept, process, or act on any application, site plan, building permit, zoning request, or other approval, including any requested confirmation, certification, approval, or other request from the OCM or other governmental entity requesting City review of any application or proposal for a business proposing to engage in the operation of a Cannabis Business.
- B. This moratorium does not apply to the selling, testing, manufacturing, or distributing of products related to the Medical Cannabis Program as administered by the Minnesota Department of Health, provided that such activity is done in accordance with the regulations and laws of Minnesota regarding Medical Cannabis.

### SECTION 5. STUDY.

The City Council hereby authorizes and directs the City Administer to have City staff conduct a study regarding the adoption or amendment of reasonable restrictions on the time, place, and manner of the operation of Cannabis Businesses, as well as the other potential local regulations allowed under the Act, and report to the City Council on the potential regulation of Cannabis Businesses. The study must include a

review of the model ordinances the OCM is directed to draft under Minnesota Statutes, section 342.13(d), an analysis of potential setback regulations allowed under Minnesota Statues, section 342.13(c), and such other matters as staff may determine are relevant to the City Council's consideration of this matter. The report shall include the City staff's recommendations on whether the City Council should adopt regulations and, if so, the recommended types of regulations.

### SECTION 6. ENFORCEMENT.

The City may enforce this Ordinance by mandamus, injunctive relief, or other appropriate civil remedy in any court of competent jurisdiction. The City Council hereby authorizes the City Administrator, in consultation with the City Attorney, to initiate any legal action deemed necessary to secure compliance with this Ordinance. A violation of this Ordinance is also subject to the City's general penalty in City Code and may result in the City reporting the violation to the OCM if relevant to OCM licensing. During the term of the moratorium, it is a violation of this Ordinance for any business, person, or entity to establish or operate a Cannabis Business within the City.

### SECTION 7. TERM.

Unless earlier rescinded by the City Council, this Ordinance shall become effective on the effective date and after adoption and publication and shall remain in effect until January I, 2025. This Ordinance may be repealed earlier upon the effective date of an ordinance adopting or amending reasonable restrictions on the time, place and manner of the operation of a Cannabis Business within the City or by resolution of the City Council terminating this Ordinance prior to the expiration date.

### SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect on August 9, 2023, and after its passage and publication according to law.

### **SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY.**

Every section, provision, and part of this Ordinance is declared severable from every other section, provision, and part thereof. If any section, provision, or part of this Ordinance is held to be invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall not invalidate any other section, provision, or part of this Ordinance.

### **ORDINANCE 622**

### AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE PROHIBITING USE OF CANNABIS IN PUBLIC SPACES OR ON PUBLIC PROPERTY

WHEREAS, The Minnesota Legislature recently enacted, and the Governor signed, 2023 Minnesota Session Laws, Chapter 63 – H.F. No. 100 ("Act"), which is comprehensive legislation relating to Cannabis including, but not limited to, legalizing and limiting the possession and use of cannabis and certain hemp products by adults effective August 1, 2023.

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Minn. Stat. section 144.417, subd. 4, the City has legal authority to adopt an ordinance regulating public use of cannabis and desires to pass such an ordinance.

WHEREAS, the Act was passed only months prior to the referenced August 1, 2023 effective date, and accordingly, the short time frame to pass this ordinance prior to the Act's effective date has necessitated passing this ordinance on an emergency basis pursuant to City Charter Chapter 3.03 to ensure the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, morals, safety and welfare ("Emergency").

**NOW, THEREFORE**, the City Council of the City of Glencoe, McLeod County, State of Minnesota, ordains:

- 1. The City Council does hereby find by unanimous vote of all five council members that the Emergency (as referenced herein) is proper and adequate under the City Charter to pass this ordinance on an Emergency basis under City Charter Section 3.03.
- 2. Section 787 of the Glencoe City Code shall read as follows:

### 787.01 Definitions

- A. <u>Public Place</u>: shall include all areas contained within the City corporate boundaries, except the following:
  - i. Private residence, including the curtilage and yard; and
  - ii. Private property not generally accessible by the public, unless a person is explicitly prohibited from consuming cannabis flower, cannabis product, lower-potency hemp edibles or hemp-derived consumer products on the property by the owner of the property;

### And

iii. The premises of an establishment or event licensed to permit on-site

consumption of cannabis flower, cannabis products, lower-potency hemp edibles or hemp-derived consumer products.

- B. <u>Public Property:</u> shall include all property, real or personal, that is owned, managed, or otherwise controlled by the City, including but not limited to:
  - i. City buildings and all the land thereon;
  - ii. Parks:
  - iii. Pathways and trails
  - iv. City rights-of-way consisting of both the traveled portion and any abutting boulevard, sidewalk, or trail.
  - v. Any city personal property, including motor vehicles, city equipment, and the like.
- C. Cannabis Flower, Cannabis Product, Lower Potency Hemp Edibles and Hemp-Derived Consumer Product shall have the meanings as defined in Minn. Stat. 342.01 (enacted under Minnesota Laws 2023).
  - 787.02 It is unlawful to use in any form Cannabis Flower, Cannabis Products, Lower-Potency Hemp Edibles or Hemp-Derived Consumer Products in any Public Place(s) within the corporate limits of the City or upon any Public Property.
  - **787.03** Violation of this Section is a petty misdemeanor as defined by Minnesota law. This Section may be enforced by the City of Glencoe's Administrative Penalty ordinance.
- 3. SUMMARY PUBLICATION. Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 412.191, in the case of a lengthy ordinance, a summary may be published. While a copy of the entire ordinance is available without cost at the office of the City Clerk, the following summary is approved by the City Council and shall be published in lieu of publishing the entire ordinance: The City is prohibiting the use of Cannabis Flower, Cannabis Products, Lower-Potency Hemp Edibles or Hemp-Derived Consumer Products in any Public Place(s) within the corporate limits of the City or upon any Public Property. A violation of this Section is a petty misdemeanor.
- 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This ordinance shall be given prompt and general publicity and it should be filed promptly by the City Administrator.
