Item 5A – Public Hearing on Delinquent Charges

Item 5A – Unless someone pays their bill before the meeting on Monday night, it is recommended to approve Resolution Number 2023-35 to assess the delinquent amounts to be collected with the property taxes.

The large assessment of \$18,230.87 is for the demolition costs of the Delores Thurn Home a few years ago as a hazardous property at 1329 13th Street East. Daniel and Renae Peterson bought the property as a tax forfeiture sale by McLeod County. The Assessment was removed by the County prior to the sale. I did have others inquire if the City proposed to re-assess the property and I informed that we did plan to re-assess. the Petersons did not contact me.

We discussed this issue at the last City Council meeting regarding the teardown costs when the City becomes involved in a hazardous property. This is how the City recoups the cost of the demolition and maintenance. We have had other properties in the past where the City ultimately recovered the costs of the demolition when the property sold. Two in recent memory were south of the Congregational Church (bought by the church) and north of the Congregational Church (purchased by Jon Dahlke for his Maple syrup making). The City received the demolition costs with the sale of the property.

Item 5B – City Engineer Justin Black will review the 2023 Pavement Project and the proposed assessment for the project.

The Public will be given the opportunity to address the City Council regarding the assessments on the project. For the majority of the Assessments will be over 5 years at 4.5% interest.

For the properties on McLeod Avenue, which was completely reconstructed, the assessments will be over 15 years at 4.5% Interest.

It is recommended to approve Resolution 2023-36 to Certify the assessments to McLeod County for collection with their property taxes.

RESOLUTION 2023 - 36 RESOLUTION ADOPTING ASSESSMENT

WHEREAS, pursuant to proper notice duly given as required by law, the council has met and heard and passed upon all objections to the proposed assessment for the **2023 Pavement Improvement Project**, which includes improvements on the following streets:

by construction of pavement reclamation and overlay, drain tile and sump pump services, thin overlay, concrete curb and gutter repairs, spot sidewalk replacement, parking lane pavement replacement, seal coat, street reconstruction with installation of new sanitary sewer, storm sewer installation, trail and roadway improvements, turf restoration, and miscellaneous items required to complete the improvements, and has amended such proposed assessment as it deems just.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF GLENCOE, MINNESOTA:

- 1. Such proposed assessment, as amended, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, is hereby accepted and shall constitute the special assessment against the lands named therein, and each tract of land therein included is hereby found to be benefited by the improvement in the amount of the assessment levied against it.
- 2. For that portion of the 2023 Pavement Improvement Project on McLeod Avenue from 11th Street to 12th Street (Alternate 1), assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2024, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.5 percent per annum after November 16, 2023. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from November 16, 2023, until December 31, 2024. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.
- 3. For all other areas of the 2023 Pavement Improvement Project, assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 5 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2024, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.5 percent per annum after November 16, 2023. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from November 16, 2023, until December 31, 2024. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.
- 4. Properties abutting the 1" overlay areas of the Reclaim/Overlay Portion will not be assessed, as that is considered a repair.
- 5. The owner of any property so assessed may, at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer on November 30, 2023, pay the whole of the assessment on such property to the office of the City Administrator, and no interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by November 16, 2022; and he may, at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.
- 6. The City Administrator shall forthwith transmit a certified duplicate of this assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer to be extended on the property tax lists of the county. Such assessment shall be collected and paid over in the same manner as other municipal taxes.

Improvements include but are not limited to construction of pavement reclamation and overlay, drain tile and sump pump services, thin overlay, concrete curb and gutter repairs, spot sidewalk replacement, parking lane pavement replacement, seal coat, street reconstruction with installation of new sanitary sewer, storm sewer installation, trail and roadway improvements, turf restoration, and miscellaneous items required to complete the improvements. Adoption by the council of the proposed assessment may occur at the hearing. The area proposed to be assessed for such improvements includes properties abutting such improvements, and non-abutting properties that benefit from the improvements.

For that portion of the 2023 Pavement Improvement Project on McLeod Avenue from 11th Street to 12th Street (Alternate 1), assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 15 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2024, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.5 percent per annum after November 16, 2023. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from November 16, 2023, until December 31, 2024. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

For all other areas of the 2023 Pavement Improvement Project, assessments shall be payable in equal annual installments extending over a period of 5 years, the first of the installments to be payable on or before the first Monday in January, 2024, and shall bear interest at the rate of 4.5 percent per annum after November 16, 2023. To the first installment shall be added interest on the entire assessment from November 16, 2023, until December 31, 2024. To each subsequent installment when due shall be added interest for one year on all unpaid installments.

Properties abutting the 1" overlay areas of the Reclaim/Overlay Portion will not be assessed, as that is considered a repair.

You may at any time prior to certification of the assessment to the County Auditor-Treasurer on November 30, 2023, pay the entire assessment on such property to the office of the City Administrator. **No interest shall be charged if the entire assessment is paid by November 16**, **2023**. You may at any time thereafter, pay to the City Administrator the entire amount of the assessment remaining unpaid, with interest accrued to December 31 of the year in which such payment is made. Such payment must be made before November 15 or interest will be charged through December 31 of the succeeding year.

If you decide not to prepay the assessment before the date given above the rate of interest that will apply is 4.5 percent per year. The right to partially prepay the assessment is available.

The proposed assessment roll is on file for public inspection at the City Administrator's office. The total cost of the project is \$5,210,180.05. The total amount of the proposed assessment is \$730,799.28. Written or oral objections will be considered at the meeting. No appeal may be taken as to the amount of an assessment unless a written objection signed by the affected property owner is filed with the City Administrator prior to the assessment hearing or presented to the presiding officer at the hearing. The council may upon such notice consider any objection to the amount of a proposed individual assessment at an adjourned meeting upon such further notice to the affected property owners as it deems advisable.


If an assessment is contested or there is an adjourned hearing, the following procedure will be followed:

- 1. The city will present its case first by calling witnesses who may testify by narrative or by examination, and by the introduction of exhibits. After each witness has testified, the contesting party will be allowed to ask questions. This procedure will be repeated with each witness until neither side has further questions.
- After the city has presented all its evidence, the objector may call witnesses or present such testimony as the objector desires. The same procedure for questioning of the city's witnesses will be followed with the objector's witnesses.
- 3. The objector may be represented by counsel.
- 4. Minnesota rules of evidence will not be strictly applied; however, they may be considered and argued to the council as to the weight of items of evidence or testimony presented to the council.
- 5. The entire proceedings will be tape-recorded (video-taped).
- 6. At the close of presentation of evidence, the objector may make a final presentation to the council based on the evidence and the law. No new evidence may be presented at this point.
- 7. The council may adopt the proposed assessment at the hearing.

An owner may appeal an assessment to district court pursuant to Minn. Stat. § 429.081 by serving notice of the appeal upon the mayor and city administrator of the city within 30 days after the adoption of the assessment and filing such notice with the district court within ten days after service upon the mayor or clerk.

Under Minn. Stat. §§ 435.193 to 435.195, the council may, in its discretion, defer the payment of this special assessment for any homestead property owned by a person 65 years of age or older for whom it would be a hardship to make the payments. When deferment of the special assessment has been granted and is terminated for any reason provided in that law, all amounts accumulated plus applicable interest become due. Any assessed property owner meeting the requirements of this law and the policy adopted under it may, within 30 days of the confirmation of the assessment, apply to the City Administrator for the prescribed form for such deferral of payment of this special assessment on their property.

Item 5C – City Attorney Ostlund will handle the public hearing on the hazardous property located at 1234 Greeley Avenue North. Tracy Reimann with MNSPECT will testify to the condition of the property.

I have Notified Gerry and Jeff Scharpe of the Public hearing. Their building is directly to the east of this building and is connected to 1234 Greeley Avenue. The Scharpe building is not considered hazardous, but there may be issues if the other building is ultimately demolished.

It is recommended to approve Resolution 2023-37 to declare the building as hazardous and send the order to District Court.

RESOLUTION 2023 - 37 RESOLUTION ORDERING REPAIR, REMOVAL OR RAZING OF HAZARDOUS PROPERTY

1. Redsmoker, LLC the record owner of real property in located at 1234 Greeley Avenue North, Glencoe, MN 55336 upon the following described property in the City of Glencoe, county of McLeod, Minnesota:

The North Half of Lot 2 in Block 32 in Town of Franklin, excepting therefrom the East 42.83 feet thereof, McLeod County, Minnesota.

- 2. On September 29, 2023 the City of Glencoe, Minnesota served a Notice of Hearing by Certified Mail and First Class Mail pursuant to Minn. Stat. 463.16 upon Redsmoker, LLC at its registered office in 8288 Red Rock Road Eden Prairie, MN 55347 setting a hearing for before the City Council on October 16, 2023 at 7:00 p.m. to consider whether the structures located upon the above described property constituted a hazardous building within the definition of Minnesota Statutes Sections 463.15 to 463.24.

 - The North Half of Lot 2 in Block 32 in Town of Franklin, excepting therefrom the East 42.83 feet thereof, McLeod County, Minnesota.
 - d. MNSPECT Report detailing the current condition of the building located at 1234 Greeley Avenue North, Glencoe, MN 55336
 - e. Testimony offered from Tracy Reimann at the hearing on October 16, 2023.
- 4. On the 16th day of October, 2023, after hearing, the City Council of the City of Glencoe found and determined as follows:
 - a. Notice of the Hearing for the October 16, 2023 hearing was properly given on September 29, 2023, to Redsmoker LLC.
 - b. The street address of 1234 Greeley Avenue North, Glencoe, MN 55336 identifies the location of the following described property in the City of Glencoe:

The North Half of Lot 2 in Block 32 in Town of Franklin, excepting therefrom the East 42.83 feet thereof, McLeod County, Minnesota.

c. Redsmoker LLC is the "Owner of Record" of the above-described property within the meaning of Minn. Stat. §463.15, Subd. 4.

- d. The structure(s) located on the above-described property are "hazardous buildings" within the meaning of Minn. Stat. §463.15, Subd. 3 for the following reasons:
 - 1. The roof is not watertight and has been admitting moisture for an extended period of time. The single-ply roofing materials and flashing appear to have failed. There is considerable evidence of water intrusion throughout the structure.
 - 2. The foundation walls and slab appear to be concrete. There appears to be approximately two feet of standing water in the basement. The furnace and water heater are partially submersed.
 - 3. Ceiling throughout the structure appears to have failed due to water intrusion. There are multiple ceiling assemblies which consist of wood framing with decorative panels and a suspended acoustical ceiling. Substantial portions of the ceiling have collapsed due to water intrusion. The roof decking was not visible from the inside of the building and there was no access to the rooftop.
 - 4. The floor coverings appear to have failed due to water intrusion. Wood plank flooring warped and with significant buckling throughout due to water intrusion. Carpet saturated. Unable to determine the condition of plank sub-flooring.
 - 5. The framing for the main floor appears to be two-by-ten joists, with wood columns and support beams. Could not access basement, thus condition of floor and support framing is unknown.
 - 6. Insulation appears to have failed due to water intrusion. Ceiling insulation appears to be fiberglass rolled insulation and vermiculite, which may contain asbestos.
 - 7. Wood veneer doors appear to have failed due to water intrusion.
 - 8. Evidence of mildew and a microbial substance which is consistent with mold throughout structure.
 - 9. The stucco finish on the north and west sides of the building has numerous cracks which could be an indication of wall failure and water admittance.
 - 10. Electrical hazards observed throughout including unprotected wiring, open electrical boxes, evidence of corrosion on main and subpanels, etc...
 - 11. It appears water, gas and electrical service have been shut off.
- e. The buildings constitute a fire hazard and a hazard to public safety and health.
- f. The conditions listed above are more fully documented in the inspection report prepared by Tracy Reimann on April 21, 2023, copies of which is attached to this Resolution.

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS RESOLVED AS FOLLOWS:

1. Redsmoker LLC, the owner of the above-described property, shall be ordered pursuant to Minnesota Statute 463.16, to make the following corrections and repairs on the property located at 1234 Greeley Avenue North, Glencoe, MN 55336 described as follows:

The North Half of Lot 2 in Block 32 in Town of Franklin, excepting therefrom the East 42.83 feet thereof, McLeod County, Minnesota.

Necessary corrections and repairs are:

- a. Repair the damage to the roof of the Property.
- b. Repair ceiling throughout the interior of the Property.
- c. Drain the standing water from flooded areas of the Property.
- d. Repair demolition work to the interior walls, ceiling, and floor of the home.
- e. Repair the cracks and damage to the North and West walls of the exterior of the Property.
- f. Repair the damage to the structural support system of the Property, including the wooden columns and framing for the main floor.
- g. Repair mold damage to the home and remove mold form Property.
- h. Repair damaged wooden veneers of doors in interior of Property.
- i. Reconnect the Property to water, gas, and electrical services.
- j. Install proper insulation in the home and remove any asbestos from the home.
- Install proper mechanical and heating systems throughout the home in compliance with the City of Glencoe's permitting process.
- I. Install proper fire protection fuel connections, electrical, mechanical, and plumbing systems in compliance with the State of Minnesota's building code.
- 2. All of the herein listed corrections and repairs must be made within thirty (30) days after the Order is served upon Redsmoker LLC. The corrections and repairs must be completed in compliance with all applicable building codes and regulations, pursuant to proper permits from the City of Glencoe.
- 3. If the corrections and repairs are not made within the time period provided in paragraph 2 of this Resolution, the building is ordered to be razed, the foundations filled and the property left free of debris in compliance with all applicable codes and regulations, pursuant to proper permits from the City of Glencoe. This must be completed within 5 days after expiration of the time period provided in paragraph 2 of this Resolution.
- 4. If the City of Glencoe is required to take action for summary enforcement of the Order it will seek authority to raze and remove the structures from the property.
- 5. A motion for summary enforcement of the **ORDER** will be made to the District Court in and for McLeod County, Minnesota, **UNLESS**:
 - a. Corrective action in conformance with the order is taken within thirty (30) days of the service of the order, or **UNLESS**:
 - b. An answer is filed and served upon the undersigned City Attorney, within twenty (20) days after the service of the order, pursuant to Minnesota Stat. §463.18.
- 6. In accordance with Minnesota Stat. §463.24, the owner or occupant must remove all personal property and/or fixtures that will reasonably interfere with the work within 5 days after expiration of the time period provided in paragraph 2 of this Resolution. If the personal property and/or fixtures are not removed and the City enforces the Order, the City may sell personal property, fixtures and/or salvage materials at a public auction after three days posted notice.
- 7. If the City is compelled to take any corrective action or action to enforce the Order, all necessary costs expended by the City shall be assessed against the real estate concerned or the landowners and collected in accordance with Minnesota Stat. §463.22 and the City may choose to acquire the

structures and real estate on which the hazardous structures are located by eminent domain, as provided in Minn. Stat. 463.152 and/or seek a money Judgement against the Owner for the cost of removing the hazardous condition.

On Friday, April 21, 2023, I executed an administrative search warrant for the property located at 1234 Greeley Avenue North. The purpose of the warrant was to gain entry into the building to determine if the structure is unsafe. We requested entry from the property owner, but access was not voluntarily provided. Glencoe police Detective Andrew Fiebelkorn accompanied me.

The structure appears to consist of one parcel (Parcel ID 22.060.2270) with three property addresses: 1234 Greeley Avenue North, 702 13th Street East & 706 13th Street East.

Observations:

- 1. The roof is not watertight and has been admitting moisture for an extended period of time. The single-ply roofing materials and flashing appear to have failed. There is considerable evidence of water intrusion throughout the structure.
- 2. The foundation walls and slab appear to be concrete. There appears to be approximately <u>two</u> <u>feet of standing water in the basement</u>. The furnace and water heater are partially submersed.
- 3. Ceiling throughout the structure appears to have failed due to water intrusion. There are multiple ceiling assemblies which consist of wood framing with decorative panels and a suspended acoustical ceiling. Substantial portions of the ceiling have collapsed due to water intrusion. The roof decking was not visible from the inside of the building and there was no access to the rooftop.
- 4. The floor coverings appear to have failed due to water intrusion. Wood plank flooring warped and with significant buckling throughout due to water intrusion. Carpet saturated. Unable to determine the condition of plank sub-flooring.

Conclusion:

Inadequate maintenance and dilapidation have diminished the structure to a point where it may not be economically feasible to repair or restore this structure. For these reasons, it is my determination that the building is hazardous. All unsafe buildings, structures, or appendages are public nuisances and must be abated by repair, rehabilitation, demolition, or removal according to Minnesota Statutes, sections <u>463.15</u> to <u>463.26</u>.

Item 6A – Supplemental Letter Agreement (SLA) with SEH for Survey work

and Soil Borings for the Hennepin Avenue project with McLeod County

Item 6A – Unfortunately, the turnback agreement with McLeod County for the exchange of City and County Roads could not be completed in time for this City Council meeting. There should be adequate time for this to be completed by the first meeting in November. There are 5 Mondays in October, so the next City Council meeting is November 6th.

As discussed at the workshop last week with County Engineer Andrew Engel, the plan is to completely reconstruct Hennepin Avenue in 2025. The City and County will enter into a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) to outline the responsibilities of both parties in this project. Engel has asked that the City of Glencoe be the lead agency in this reconstruction project, which means the City of Glencoe will enter into the contracts for construction and will be reimbursed at a prorated rate based on City costs (utilities) and County costs (Street surface). The share based upon initial cost estimates is 36% City and 64% County. The JPA will also be presented at the November 6th meeting.

Engel agrees that we should get the survey work done before winter and also get the soil borings completed. This will give the City Engineer time to complete the preliminary report this winter and define the cost estimates based upon the existing conditions.



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Attached is SLA with SEH to complete the topographical survey work and for Braun Intertec to complete the soil borings prior to the frost setting in.

The Survey work is estimated, not to exceed, \$18,500 and the Soil Boring and Geotechnical report is \$11,000 for a total of \$29,500. The City's cost is \$10,620 and the County's cost is \$18,800 based upon the prorated shares of the project.

It is recommended to proceed with these initial phases of the Hennepin Project. The Exchange Agreement and the JPA will be presented at the November 6th meeting.

This letter outlines our proposed services for topographic survey on the 2025 Hennepin Avenue (CSAH 2) Street and Utility Improvement Project.

It will be important to complete the topographic survey work this fall before snow and ice make it more difficult and costly to gather data.

PROJECT UNDERSTANDING

The 2025 Hennepin Avenue (CSAH 2) Street and Utility Improvement Project has been discussed with both the City and McLeod County over the past several years as the first reconstruction project as part of a turnback agreement between the City of Glencoe and McLeod County. The project will include the following improvements:

- Complete street reconstruction to 10-ton design on Hennepin Avenue (CSAH 2) and 18th Street (CSAH 2).
- Complete street reconstruction to 7-ton City Standard on 2 blocks of 15th Street.
- Installation of drain tile with sump pump services.
- Replacement of all curb and gutter, sidewalks, and driveways, including a new 10 foot trail on Hennepin Avenue.
- Sanitary sewer main and services replacement.
- Water main and services replacement.
- Storm sewer replacement and installation of a new trunk main on Hennepin Avenue.

A Project Map is attached to this letter to show the proposed project areas.

SCOPE OF SERVICES

This proposal only includes time for the topographic survey work. A proposal will be submitted in the future for meeting with City and County staff to review preliminary design and cost estimates. The preliminary design will include looking at the overall geometric layout of the project including turning movements and alignments of both 16th Street and Hennepin Avenue, and 18th Street and Hennepin

Avenue. That proposal scope of services will take the project through the feasibility report and public hearing stage of the project, it will not include the final design or construction administration services. After the feasibility report is presented to the city council and a public hearing is held, we would submit a proposal for final design services based on the project scope and improvement areas as approved by the city council at the public hearing.

The fee outlined below includes a budget line item for completing soil borings on the project. As with past projects in the City of Glencoe, Braun Intertec would complete the soil borings. The soil boring information will be important to confirm some of the initial cost estimates and street pavement sections for the project.



Payments to Consultant for Services and Expenses Using the Hourly Basis Option

The Agreement for Professional Services is amended and supplemented to include the following agreement of the parties:

A. Hourly Basis Option

The Client and Consultant select the hourly basis for payment for services provided by Consultant. Consultant shall be compensated monthly. Monthly charges for services shall be based on Consultant's current billing rates for applicable employees plus charges for expenses and equipment.

Consultant will provide an estimate of the costs for services in this Agreement. It is agreed that after 90% of the estimated compensation has been earned and if it appears that completion of the services cannot be accomplished within the remaining 10% of the estimated compensation, Consultant will notify the Client and confer with representatives of the Client to determine the basis for completing the work.

Compensation to Consultant based on the rates is conditioned on completion of the work within the effective period of the rates. Should the time required to complete the work be extended beyond this period, the rates shall be appropriately adjusted.

B. Expenses

The following items involve expenditures made by Consultant employees or professional consultants on behalf of the Client. Their costs are not included in the hourly charges made for services but instead are reimbursable expenses required in addition to hourly charges for services and shall be paid for as described in this Agreement:

- 1. Transportation and travel expenses.
- Long distance services, dedicated data and communication services, teleconferences, Project Web sites, and extranets.
- 3. Lodging and meal expense connected with the Project.
- 4. Fees paid, in the name of the Client, for securing approval of authorities having jurisdiction over the Project.
- 5. Plots, Reports, plan and specification reproduction expenses.
- 6. Postage, handling and delivery.
- 7. Expense of overtime work requiring higher than regular rates, if authorized in advance by the Client.
- 8. Renderings, models, mock-ups, professional photography, and presentation materials requested by the Client.
- 9. All taxes levied on professional services and on reimbursable expenses.
- 10. Other special expenses required in connection with the Project.
- 11. The cost of special consultants or technical services as required. The cost of subconsultant services shall include actual expenditure plus 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance. Subconsultant services shall be contracted directly with the Client when possible, and otherwise the Consultant cost shall include actual expenditures but not the 10% markup for the cost of administration and insurance as noted, unless otherwise approved by the Client.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for expenses.

C. Equipment Utilization

The utilization of specialized equipment, including automation equipment, is recognized as benefiting the Client. The Client, therefore, agrees to pay the cost for the use of such specialized equipment on the project. Consultant invoices to the Client will contain detailed information regarding the use of specialized equipment on the project and charges will be based on the standard rates for the equipment published by Consultant.

The Client shall pay Consultant monthly for equipment utilization.

This Agreement is between the State of Minnesota, acting through its Commissioner of Transportation ("State"), and the City of Glencoe, acting through its City Council ("City").

Recitals

- 1. The State will perform grading, roundabout, concrete & bituminous surfacing, ADA improvements, and lighting construction and other associated construction upon, along, and adjacent to Trunk Highway No. 212 from 1,023 feet west of County State Aid Highway (CSAH) No. 15 (Morningside Avenue) to 2,115 feet east of Morningside Avenue and located on Morningside Avenue from 477 feet south of Trunk Highway No. 212 to 483 feet north of Trunk Highway No. 212 according to State-prepared plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 043-070-021 (CSAH 15) and No. 4310-95 (TH 212=012) ("Project"); and
- 2. The City has requested the State include in its Project water main and bollard construction; and
- 3. The City requests that it perform certain aspects of the construction engineering in connection with the water main construction and the State concurs in that request; and
- 4. The City wishes to participate in the costs of the water main, casting adjustment, storm sewer, and bollard construction and associated State performed construction engineering; and
- 5. Agreement No. 1053492 between the State and McLeod County will address the detour needed for the Project; and
- 6. Minnesota Statutes § 161.45, subdivision 2, allows for City-owned utility relocation to be included in a State construction contract, and payment by the City for such relocation according to applicable statutes and rules for utilities on trunk highways; and
- 7. Minnesota Statutes § 161.20, subdivision 2 authorizes the Commissioner of Transportation to make arrangements with and cooperate with any governmental authority for the purposes of constructing, maintaining, and improving the trunk highway system.

Agreement

- 1. Term of Agreement; Survival of Terms; Plans; Incorporation of Exhibits
 - **1.1.** *Effective Date.* This Agreement will be effective on the date the State obtains all signatures required by Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 2.

1.2. Expiration Date. This Agreement will expire when all obligations have been satisfactorily fulfilled.

- 1.3. Survival of Terms. All clauses which impose obligations continuing in their nature and which must survive in order to give effect to their meaning will survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement, including, without limitation, the following clauses: 3. Maintenance by the City; 8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims; 10. State Audits; 11. Government Data Practices; 12. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue; and 14. Force Majeure.
- **1.4.** *Plans, Specifications, and Special Provisions.* Plans, specifications, and special provisions designated by the State as State Project No. 043-070-021 (CSAH 15) and No. 4310-95 (TH 212=012) are on file in the office of the Commissioner of Transportation at St. Paul, Minnesota, and incorporated into this Agreement by reference ("Project Plans").
- **1.5.** *Exhibits.* Preliminary Schedule "I" is on file in the office of the City Administrator and attached and incorporated into this Agreement.

2. Construction by the State

- **2.1.** *Contract Award.* The State will advertise for bids and award a construction contract to the lowest responsible bidder according to the Project Plans.
- 2.2. Direction, Supervision, and Inspection of Construction.
 - **A.** Supervision and Inspection by the State. The State will direct and supervise all construction activities performed under the construction contract, and except as provided below, perform all construction engineering and inspection functions in connection with the contract construction. All contract construction will be performed according to the Project Plans.
 - B. Construction Engineering and Inspection by the City. The City will assign its City Engineer or other registered professional engineer to perform construction engineering in connection with the water main construction. The engineer so assigned will act under the supervision and direction of the State and be responsible for construction inspection, control of materials, and staking and associated documentation for said construction. The construction will be performed according to the Project Plans and recognized and accepted practices and procedures as set forth in various State manuals, including Specifications No. 1601 through and including No. 1609 in the State's current "Standard Specifications for Construction". The City will furnish other personnel, services, supplies, and equipment needed to properly carry on the construction.
 - i. Documentation of Construction Costs. At regular intervals after the State's contractor has started the water main construction, the City will prepare partial estimates of the construction costs according to the terms of the construction contract and immediately submit the partial estimates to the State. The City will also prepare the final estimate data for said construction and submit the final estimate to the State. Quantities listed on the partial and final estimates will be documented according to guidelines in the applicable documentation manual.
 - ii. Final Inspection of Construction. Upon completion of the water main construction, the City will advise the State whether or not said construction should be accepted by the State as being performed in a satisfactory manner. If the City recommends that the State not accept the construction, then the City will, as part of their recommendation, identify the specific defects in the construction and the reasons why it should not be accepted. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will determine, after considering the City's recommendations, whether or not the construction has been properly performed and whether to accept or reject it.

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iii. Inspection of Other City Participation Construction. The remainder of the City participation construction covered under this Agreement will be open to inspection by the City. If the City believes the City participation construction covered under this Agreement has not been properly performed or that the construction is defective, the City will inform the State District Engineer's authorized representative in writing of those defects. Any recommendations made by the City are not binding on the State. The State will have the exclusive right to determine whether the State's contractor has satisfactorily performed the City participation construction covered under this Agreement.

2.3. Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.

- A. The State will make changes in the Project Plans and contract construction, which may include the City participation construction covered under this Agreement and will enter into any necessary addenda and change orders with the State's contractor that are necessary to cause the contract construction to be performed and completed in a satisfactory manner. The State District Engineer's authorized representative will inform the appropriate City official of any proposed addenda and change orders to the construction contract that will affect the City participation construction covered under this Agreement.
- **B.** The City may request additional work or changes to the work in the plans as part of the construction contract. Such request will be made by an exchange of letter(s) with the State. If the State determines that the requested additional work or plan changes are necessary or desirable and can be accommodated without undue disruption to the project, the State will cause the additional work or plan changes to be made.
- **2.4.** Satisfactory Completion of Contract. The State will perform all other acts and functions necessary to cause the construction contract to be completed in a satisfactory manner.

2.5. Permits.

- A. The City will submit to the State's Utility Engineer an original permit application for all utilities owned by the City to be constructed hereunder that are upon and within the Trunk Highway Right-of-Way. Applications for permits will be made on State form "Application for Utility Permit on Trunk Highway Right-of-Way" (Form 2525).
- **B.** *Limited Use Permit No. 4310-0008.* The City will obtain, through the District's Right-of-Way Area Manager, a Limited Use Permit to cover the City's liability responsibilities of the trail and bollards to be constructed upon the State Right-of-Way.
- 2.6. Utility Adjustments. Adjustments to certain City-owned facilities, including but not limited to, valve boxes and frame and ring castings, may be performed by the State's contractor under the construction contract. The City will furnish the contractor with new units and/or parts for those in place City-owned facilities when replacements are required and not covered by a contract pay item, without cost or expense to the State or the contractor, except for replacement of units and/or parts broken or damaged by the contractor.

3. Maintenance by the City

Upon completion of the Project, the City will provide the following without cost or expense to the State:

3.1. Storm Sewers. Routine maintenance of any storm sewer facilities construction. Routine maintenance includes, but is not limited to, removal of sediment, debris, vegetation, and ice from grates and catch basins, and any other maintenance activities necessary to preserve the facilities and to prevent conditions

such as flooding, erosion, or sedimentation, this also includes informing the District Maintenance Engineer of any needed repairs.

- **3.2.** *Municipal Utilities.* Maintenance of any municipal-owned utilities construction, without cost or expense to the State.
- **3.3.** *Sidewalks.* Maintenance of any sidewalk construction, including stamped and colored concrete sidewalk (if any) and pedestrian ramps. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow, ice and debris removal, patching, crack repair, panel replacement, pedestrian crosswalk markings, vegetation control of boulevards (if any), and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the sidewalks in a safe, useable, and aesthetically acceptable condition.
- 3.4. Trails. Maintenance of any trail construction. Maintenance includes, but is not limited to, snow and ice control/removal, sweeping and debris removal, patching, crack repair, pavement replacement, vegetation control, signing, pavement markings, bollards, and any other maintenance activities necessary to perpetuate the bikeways and shared use paths in a safe and usable condition. LUP 4310-0008 will further define trail and bollard maintenance.
- 3.5. TH 212 Roundabout Lighting System "A". Maintenance of lighting at and approaching the roundabout, including all legs and within the roundabout, will be shared between the State and the City. The City will be responsible for the Gopher State One Call (GSOC) locates, hook up cost and application to secure an adequate power supply to the service pad or pole and will pay all monthly electrical service expenses necessary to operate the lighting facility. The City will be responsible for minor maintenance, including, but not limited to re-lamping or LED luminaire replacement, repair or replacement of all damaged luminaire glassware, luminaires when damaged or when ballasts fail, photoelectric control on luminaires, and painting of poles and other equipment, if applicable, for the entire system. The State will be responsible for major maintenance, including, but not limited to knocked down poles including wiring within the poles, damaged poles, pull boxes, underground wire, loose connections, damaged foundations, defective starter boards or drivers, damaged fuse holders, and blown fuses for the entire system.
- **3.6.** Additional Drainage. No party to this Agreement will drain any additional drainage volume into the storm sewer facilities constructed under the construction contract that was not included in the drainage for which the storm sewer facilities were designed, without first obtaining written permission to do so from the other party.

4. Basis of City Cost

- **4.1.** Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" includes anticipated City participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share covered under this Agreement and is based on engineer's estimated unit prices.
- **4.2.** *City Participation Construction.* The City will participate in the following at the percentages indicated. The construction includes the City's proportionate share of item costs for Mobilization, Combination Field Laboratory Office, and Traffic Control.
 - **A.** 100 Percent will be the City's rate of cost participation in all of the water main, casting adjustment, storm sewer, and bollard construction. The construction includes, but is not limited to, those construction items tabulated on Sheet No. 2 of the Preliminary Schedule "I".
- **4.3.** Construction Engineering Costs. The City will pay a construction engineering charge equal to 3 percent of the total water main City participation construction covered under Article 4.2.A. The City will pay a construction engineering charge equal to 8 percent of the remainder of the City participation construction covered under this Agreement.

4.4. *Plan Changes, Additional Construction, Etc.* The City will share in the costs of construction contract addenda and change orders that are necessary to complete the City participation construction covered under this Agreement, including any City requested additional work and plan changes.

The State reserves the right to invoice the City for the cost of any additional City requested work and plan changes, construction contract addenda, change orders, and associated construction engineering before the completion of the contract construction.

4.5. Liquidated Damages. All liquidated damages assessed the State's contractor in connection with the construction contract will result in a credit shared by each party in the same proportion as their total construction cost share covered under this Agreement is to the total contract construction cost before any deduction for liquidated damages.

5. City Cost and Payment by the City

- 5.1. City Cost. \$232,435.56 is the City's estimated share of the costs of the contract construction and the construction engineering cost share as shown in the Preliminary Schedule "I". The Preliminary Schedule "I" was prepared using anticipated construction items and estimated quantities and unit prices and may include any credits or lump sum costs. Upon award of the construction contract, the State will prepare a Revised Schedule "I" based on construction contract construction items, quantities, and unit prices, which will replace and supersede the Preliminary Schedule "I" as part of this Agreement.
- **5.2.** Conditions of Payment. The City will pay the State the City's total estimated construction and construction engineering cost share, as shown in the Revised Schedule "I", after the following conditions have been met:
 - A. Execution of this Agreement and transmittal to the City, including a copy of the Revised Schedule "I".
 - **B.** The City's receipt of a written request from the State for the advancement of funds.
- **5.3.** Acceptance of the City's Cost and Completed Construction. The computation by the State of the amount due from the City will be final, binding and conclusive. Acceptance by the State of the completed contract construction will be final, binding, and conclusive upon the City as to the satisfactory completion of the contract construction.
- 5.4. Final Payment by the City. Upon completion of all contract construction and upon computation of the final amount due the State's contractor, the State will prepare a Final Schedule "I" and submit a copy to the City. The Final Schedule "I" will be based on final quantities and include all City participation construction items and the construction engineering cost share covered under this Agreement. If the final cost of the City participation construction exceeds the amount of funds advanced by the City, the City will pay the difference to the State without interest. If the final cost of the City participation construction is less than the amount of funds advanced by the City, the State will refund the difference to the City without interest.

The State and the City waive claims for any payments or refunds less than \$5.00 according to Minnesota Statutes § 15.415.

6. Authorized Representatives

Each party's Authorized Representative is responsible for administering this Agreement and is authorized to give and receive any notice or demand required or permitted by this Agreement.

7. Assignment; Amendments; Waiver; Contract Complete

7.1. Assignment. No party may assign or transfer any rights or obligations under this Agreement without the prior consent of the other party and a written assignment agreement, executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved this Agreement, or their successors in office. The foregoing does not prohibit the City from contracting with a third-party to perform City maintenance responsibilities covered under this Agreement.

- **7.2.** Amendments. Any amendment to this Agreement must be in writing and will not be effective until it has been executed and approved by the same parties who executed and approved the original Agreement, or their successors in office.
- **7.3.** Waiver. If a party fails to enforce any provision of this Agreement, that failure does not waive the provision or the party's right to subsequently enforce it.
- **7.4.** Contract Complete. This Agreement contains all prior negotiations and agreements between the State and the City. No other understanding regarding this Agreement, whether written or oral, may be used to bind either party.

8. Liability; Worker Compensation Claims

- **8.1.** Each party is responsible for its own acts, omissions, and the results thereof to the extent authorized by law and will not be responsible for the acts and omissions of others and the results thereof. Minnesota Statutes § 3.736 and other applicable law govern liability of the State. Minnesota Statutes Chapter 466 and other applicable law govern liability of the City.
- **8.2.** Each party is responsible for its own employees for any claims arising under the Workers Compensation Act.

9. Nondiscrimination

Provisions of Minnesota Statutes § 181.59 and of any applicable law relating to civil rights and discrimination are considered part of this Agreement.

10. State Audits

Under Minnesota Statutes § 16C.05, subdivision 5, the City's books, records, documents, accounting procedures, and practices relevant to this Agreement are subject to examination by the State and the State Auditor or Legislative Auditor, as appropriate, for a minimum of six years from the end of this Agreement.

11. Government Data Practices

The City and State must comply with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Minnesota Statutes Chapter 13, as it applies to all data provided under this Agreement, and as it applies to all data created, collected, received, stored, used, maintained, or disseminated by the City under this Agreement. The civil remedies of Minnesota Statutes §13.08 apply to the release of the data referred to in this clause by either the City or the State.

12. Governing Law; Jurisdiction; Venue

Minnesota law governs the validity, interpretation, and enforcement of this Agreement. Venue for all legal proceedings arising out of this Agreement, or its breach, must be in the appropriate state or federal court with competent jurisdiction in Ramsey County, Minnesota.

13. Termination; Suspension

- 13.1. By Mutual Agreement. This Agreement may be terminated by mutual agreement of the parties.
- **13.2.** *Termination for Insufficient Funding.* The State may immediately terminate this Agreement if it does not obtain funding from the Minnesota Legislature, or other funding source; or if funding cannot be continued at a level sufficient to allow for the performance of contract construction under the Project. Termination must be by written or fax notice to the City.
- **13.3.** *Suspension.* In the event of a total or partial government shutdown, the State may suspend this Agreement and all work, activities and performance of work authorized through this Agreement.

14. Force Majeure

No party will be responsible to the other for a failure to perform under this Agreement (or a delay in performance), if such failure or delay is due to a force majeure event. Appointment of Charter Commission Members

This memorandum is being provided to you regarding the procedure for appointing applicants to the City's Charter Commission.

Overview of the Appointment Process

Pursuant to Minn. Stat. 410.05, the City may seek to appoint individuals to the City's Charter Commission either by a petition signed by 10% of the voters who voted in the last election or via resolution approved by the City and submitted to the District Court for approval.

Once a resolution has been approved, the City will submit the applications for appointment to the City's Charter Commission, and the City's resolution and proposed order for the makeup of the Commission. Once the Court has received all necessary documents and resolved any potential conflicts of interest, the Court will issue an order confirming the makeup of the Commission and appoint the proposed members to the Commission. The District Court Clerk will then notify the appointees who have 30 days to file a written acceptance and oath of office with the Court.1 Should any member of the Commission vacate their position, the Chief Judge of the District Court will, upon resolution of the City, fill that position for the remaining term.

Structure of the Commission

Minn. Stat. 410.05 subd. 1 & subd. 2 provides that each charter commission shall be composed of not less than 7 members and not more than 15 members. Of the members serving on the Commission, a maximum of 8 shall be appointed to serve for a term of 2 years and a maximum of 7 shall be appointed to serve for a term of 4 years. As such, appointments are typically staggered such that the City should be seeking to appoint/reappoint members every two years.

¹ For those appointees who fail to return their acceptance and oath within the allotted 30 day time limit, they will be treated as having rejected the appointment and their position will remain vacant until filled by subsequent appointment by the Court.

The Resolution Currently before the Commission

Here, the City (re)appointed 7 members to serve on the Charter Commission starting January 1, 2022. Three of these appointees were appointed to serve a 2 year term ending on January 1, 2024 and 4 of the appointees were appointed to serve a 4 year term ending on January 1, 2026. However, the District Court did not issue an order approving the 2022 members as is required by statute. Further, several members have since vacated their appointed positions reducing the number of members currently serving on the Charter Commission to a number below the statutorily allowed minimum. Therefore, the resolution currently before the City Council seeks to confirm the appointment of the 2022 members who are currently serving with the District Court and to simultaneously fill the remaining vacancies on the Commission. Per Minn. Stat. 410.05, these appointees will continue to serve out the remainder of the terms they are appointed to. Once each member has served the remainder of their appointed term, they may apply for reappointment with the District Court.

The Commission shall advise the City Council in all matters dealing with the airport and its operations.

Charter Commission: The Charter Commission members serve a two or four year term and meet as statutorily required.

Cemetery Board: The Cemetery Board meets quarterly on a Wednesday at 10:00 a.m. at the City Center. The board consists of 5 members. One said board member may be a member of the City Council or the Mayor. The board sets rules for governing the operation and use and maintenance of the municipal cemetery.

City Center Board: The City Center Board meets monthly at 7:30 a.m. at the City Center. The board consists of 5 members who are either residents of the City of Glencoe or one individual who is a business owner who owns property within the city limits of Glencoe and who resides within 10 miles of the City of Glencoe. One of said board members may be a member of the City Council or the Mayor. The City Center Board shall make recommendations regarding the administration, maintenance and control of the City Center, including the Event Center, and available space within the building.

Library Board: The Library Board meets at 7:00 p.m. the 2nd Tuesday at the Library. The board consists of 5 members who are residents of the City of Glencoe and one such member at the option of the City Council, may be a legal voter, not residing in the City of Glencoe but shall reside within 10 miles of the City of Glencoe. One said board member may be a member of the City Council or the Mayor. The Library Board is an advisory board to the City of Glencoe regarding administration, maintenance and control of the library.

Park Board: The Park Board meets at 6:30 p.m. the 4th Wednesday/monthly at the City Center. The commission consists of 6 members and are residents of the City of Glencoe or one individual who is a business owner who owns property within the city limits of Glencoe and who resides within 10 miles of the City of Glencoe. One board member may be a member of the City Council or the Mayor. Members serve staggered 3 year terms.

Planning Commission: The Planning and Industrial Commission meets the 2nd Thursday at 7:00 p.m. at the City Center. The commission consists of 5 members. The City Council may select one member of the commission from among its members. The Planning Commission shall have all the powers and duties defined or granted in the statutes and the City Code relating to planning, zoning and subdivision regulation and shall act in an advisory capacity to the City Council.

Light and Power Commission: The Light and Power Commission meets the 4th Monday at 7:30 p.m. at the Light Plant. The commission consists of 5 members all of whom shall be qualified voters of the City of Glencoe and be appointed by the City Council. The commission has control and management of the generation, acquisition and distribution of electric energy in the City of Glencoe.

Item 8A – Attached is Ordinance 623 that was reviewed at the workshop last week regarding outlawing farm animals and allowing for the keeping of chickens.

The Planning and Industrial Commission review this week and recommended removing allowing chickens in R-2 or multifamily properties. The are only allowed in R1 – Single family neighborhoods. No Roosters will be allowed.

ORDINANCE NO. 623

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CERTAIN PORTIONS OF CITY CODE PERTAINING TO ANIMALS, AMENDING ORDINANCE ADDING SECTION 704 TO ALLOW THE KEEPING OF BACKYARD CHICKENS

Findings and Purpose:

A. It is the purpose and intent of this section to amend the City of Glencoe's ordinance(s) pertaining generally to animals regarding several issues, including but not limited, to allow, but strictly limit, the keeping of backyard chickens as an egg source in a clean and sanitary manner which is not a nuisance to or detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare of the city of Glencoe.

The City Council of Glencoe, Minnesota ordains:

Section 1. Section 701, Subdivision 1(R) is amended to read:

- R. *Wild Animal* is every non-human species of the animal kingdom, including those born or raised in captivity except the following:
 - (1) Domestic dogs (excluding hybrids with wolves, coyotes or jackals)
 - (2) Domestic cats (excluding hybrids with ocelots or margays) properly vaccinated against rabies pursuant to law;
 - (3) Farm animals, including bees, Chickens (No Roosters), licensed pursuant to City Code Section 704. Vietnamese pot-bellied pigs, and pigeons, provided that no more than one Vietnamese pot-bellied pig and no more than five pigeons can be kept on any one lot or premises;
 - (4) Rodents, including hamsters, mice, gerbils, white rats, guinea pigs, hedgehogs, capable of being maintained continuously in cages;
 - (5) Rabbits;
 - (6) Captive-bred species of common cage birds;
 - (7) Small non-poisonous snakes;
 - (8) Chinchillas, non-poisonous lizards, and other similar small species capable to being maintain continuously in cages;
 - (9) Fish, unless prohibited by state or federal law.
 - (10) Neutered male or spayed female domestic ferrets.

Section 2. The following Section 704 shall be added to the City Code:

- 704.01 It is the purpose and intent of this section to allow, but strictly limit, the keeping of backyard chickens as an egg source in a clean and sanitary manner which is not a nuisance to or detrimental to the public health, safety, and welfare of the city of Glencoe.
- 704.02 Keeping Of Backyard Chickens Allowed: A person may keep up to six (6) backyard chickens on property zoned R-1 residential only as provided for in section 509 of this code as provided for in section 509 of this code provided that:
 - a. The owner of the backyard chickens resides in a detached dwelling located upon the parcel at which the backyard chickens are kept.
 - b. The owner of the subject parcel remains at all times in compliance with this section.

- 704.01 The city may inspect the premises in order to ensure compliance with this section. If the city is not able to obtain the occupant's consent to enter the property, it may seek an administrative search warrant to inspect any premises for compliance with this section.
- 704.02 Upon reasonable written notice, the city may revoke the right issued under this section if a property owner fails or refuses to comply with the requirements of this section or any state or local law governing the cruelty to animals or the keeping of animals. Any person whose right to own and keep backyard chickens is revoked shall have the right to appeal the revocation to the City Council.
- 704.03 Any person whose right under this section for the keeping of backyard chickens is revoked or who fails to otherwise comply with the terms on this seciotn, within ten (10) days thereafter, humanely dispose of all chickens owned, kept or harbored by such person on the subject property.

704.04 General Standards For The Keeping Of Backyard Chickens:

- a. The keeping of roosters is prohibited under this section.
- b. Backyard chickens shall not be raised or kept for the purpose of fighting.
- c. Backyard chickens shall not be kept in a dwelling, garage or accessory structure other than those meeting the requirements of an enclosed coop.
- d. All backyard chickens shall have access to an enclosed coop meeting the following minimum standards:
 - i. The enclosed coop may not occupy a front or side yard.
 - ii. A maximum of one coop per lot shall be permitted.
 - iii. The enclosed coop shall have a minimum size of four (4) square feet per chicken and shall not exceed a maximum of forty (40) square feet in total area.
 - iv. The enclosed coop shall be set back a minimum of twenty-five feet (25') from the principal structure, at least ten feet (10') from all property lines and shall not encroach upon utility easements.
 - v. The enclosed coop shall not exceed ten feet (10') in height.
 - vi. The enclosed coop shall be the same or similar in color to the principal structure on the lot.
 - vii. Enclosed coops shall be compatible with the principal building on the lot. Under no circumstances shall sheet metal, corrugated metal, asbestos, iron, plain concrete block (whether painted or color integrated or not) be deemed acceptable as major exterior wall materials. "Compatible" means that the exterior appearance of the coop (accessory building) is not at variance with the principal building from an aesthetic and architectural standpoint as to cause:

- a. A nuisance which may have characteristics related to noise, dust, odors, glare, and unsightly building exterior.
- e. The enclosed coop shall be built to protect the backyard chickens from extreme heat or cold.
 - i. The enclosed coop shall be at all times maintained in a good condition.
- f. All backyard chickens shall have access to a run.
- g. The following minimum sanitation standards shall be observed at all times:
- h. The slaughtering of backyard chickens on the property is prohibited.
- i. No chicken or chicken byproducts shall be sold upon the subject property.
- j. All premises on which backyard chickens are kept or maintained shall be kept clean from filth, garbage, and any substances which attract rodents. The coop and its surrounding area shall be cleaned frequently to control odor. Manure shall not be allowed to accumulate in a way that causes an unsanitary condition or causes odors to be detectible from another property. Failure to comply with these conditions may result in the removal of backyard chickens from the premises.
- k. All grain and food stored for backyard chickens shall be kept indoors in a rodentproof container.
- I. Backyard chickens shall be kept in such a manner which does not constitute a nuisance as provided for in chapter 5, article b of this title.
- m. Persons no longer intending to keep backyard chickens on the subject property shall notify the city in writing and remove the enclosed coop and run.
- n. The enclosed coop and run shall be removed from the property upon revocation of the right to have backyard chickens, at the property owner's expense.
- o. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than \$300.

Section 3. This ordinance becomes effective from and after its passage and publication.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson Wes Olson at 1900 hours. Other Commissioners present were Bob Scheidt and Kevin Dietz. Commissioners Bob Senst and Barb Jenneke were absent. Also present were City Administrator Mark Larson, City Council Liaison Mark Hueser, City Mayor Ryan Voss, City Attorney Mark Ostlund and Karin Ramige of the McLeod County Chronicle.

Planning Commission Item One: Approve Minutes from the September 14th Planning Commission Meeting.

Scheidt motioned to approve. Dietz seconded. Motion passed 3-0.

Planning Commission Item Two: Set Public Hearing on Revocation of Special Use Permit for Tracy Larson, 430 Edgewood Drive for Swimming Pool – Mark Ostlund, City Attorney.

This item was discussed by City Attorney Mark Ostlund. The City resolved to approve Tracy Larson's petition for a special use permit for an above ground pool exceeding 5000 gallons at her residence located at 430 Edgewood Drive on the condition that she complete and receive approval for a building permit and that a 6-foot privacy fence be constructed. As of this meeting on October 11, 2023, no fence was ever constructed.

On the advice of the City Attorney, it was advised to set a Public Hearing on the matter. Dietz motioned that the matter be scheduled for a Public Hearing for 11-9-23 at 7:00 PM at the next Planning Commission meeting. Scheidt seconded. The motion passed 3-0.

Planning Commission Item Three: Chicken / Animal Ordinance and Zoning Districts – Mark Ostlund, City Attorney.

City Attorney Ostlund advised that this area involved City Ordinance Section 701 subdivision 1 (r) concerning permitted animals within the City of Glencoe. This was amending section 701 Ordinance by adding Section 704 concerning the requirements for Chickens. Housing in the area Zoned R1 must meet the requirements for housing the Chickens and follow setbacks and accepted building materials for Chicken Coops. No Roosters are allowed. It was thought best not to allow Chickens in areas that were Zoned R2. The matter will be brought up at the next City Council Meeting on October 16, 2023.

Planning Commission Item Four: Continue Discussion on Zoning Ordinance Updates – Mark Ostlund, City Attorney.

This was a discussion topic. The Planning Commission was shown two maps with the current City Zoning areas and the Zoning map from the Comprehensive Plan 5.4.1. It was thought that it would be beneficial to have the Official Zoning Map and the Future Land Use Map brought together as one, so the maps reflect the Zoning Ordinances. It was also discussed what would happen if an area outside the city were zoned for housing in the future, but currently is considered Agriculture land. How would the County look at this for tax purposes. Another discussion area was concerning isolated small areas that were zoned Business or Industrial within a larger area zoned for R1 Housing as an example. It was thought best to work for larger areas that were zoned for the same use. This discussion will continue.

Planning Commission Item Five: Adjourn

Scheidt motioned to Adjourn. Olson seconded. Motion passed 3 – 0. Meeting Adjourned at 1959 hours.
