City Engineers attend weekly Public Works meetings, project cost estimates, development site plan review, architectural, and structural reviews, and environmental services. They coordinate with MnDOT, McLeod County, MPCA, MDH, and BCWD and assist with MS4 and MPCA Wastewater permits. The agreement for Professional Services includes being billed hourly for authorized work, not to exceed \$50,000 for general engineering services, not to exceed \$10,000 for general Municipal State Aid engineering services, and separate agreements for larger standalone projects. It is recommended to approve the Master Agreement with SEH.

WHEREAS, a Roadway Jurisdictional Transfer Cooperative Agreement has been approved by the City of Glencoe and McLeod County which delineates requirements of the City and County as it relates to the transfer of roadway segments between the two agencies; and

WHEREAS, The County and the City have further agreed to transfer jurisdiction of the following City roadway segments from the City to the County:

Part of MSAS 102: 11th Street W. from the west city limits to N. Armstrong Avenue (0.58 miles)

Part of MSAS 105: N. Armstrong Avenue from 11th Street W. to 13th Street (TH 22) (0.14 miles)

MSAS 116: 18th Street E. from Ford Avenue N. (CSAH2) to Hennepin Avenue N. (CR 83) (0.17 miles)

Collectively, the revoked Municipal State Aid Streets.

WHEREAS, The County and City have agreed to transfer jurisdiction of the following County roadway segments from the County to the City:

CSAH 2 (Ford Avenue N.) from 13th Street E. (TH22) to 18th Street E (0.38 miles)

Collectively, the relinquished County Roadways.

WHEREAS, it appears to the City Council of Glencoe that the streets hereinafter described should be described as or designated as Municipal State Aid streets under the provisions of Minnesota Laws;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Glencoe, Minnesota:

- 1. That the streets described as follows to-wit:
 - a. Part of MSAS 102: 11th Street W. from the west city limits to N. Armstrong Avenue (0.58 miles)
 - b. Part of MSAS 105: N. Armstrong Avenue from 11th Street to W. to 13th Street (TH 22) (0.14 miles)
 - c. MSAS 116: 18th Street E. from Ford Avenue N. (CSAH2) to Hennepin Avenue N. (CR 83) (0.17 miles)

be revoked as a Municipal State Aid Streets of said City, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of Minnesota.

- 2. That the streets described as follows to-wit:
- a. Ford Avenue N. from 13th Street E. (TH22) to 18th Street E (0.38 miles) Be herby established, located and designated as a Municipal State Aid Street of the City of Glencoe, subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of Minnesota.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Administrator is hereby authorized and directed to forward two (2) certified copies of this resolution to the Commissioner of Transportation for this consideration and that upon the Commissioner's approval of the revocations of said streets or portion thereof, that the same be revoked as Municipal State Street and that upon the Commissioner's approval of the designation of said streets or portions thereof, that same be constructed and improved and maintained as a Municipal State Aid Streets of the City of Glencoe, to be numbered and known as a Municipal State Aid Street.

Requesting approval to remove and replace 9 windows inside the conference room. The roof was replaced, and the back portion of the police department was rebuilt afterwards. Unfortunately, these windows continue to leak resulting in buckets being placed on the floors to catch water at times, additional ceiling tiles have been wrecked, as well as sheetrock that has been wrecked. The items that sustained water damage were just replaced in the rebuild.

I'm requesting that all the current windows are taken out and have new windows installed for \$14,474. The conference room is used daily, and the light that is allowed in is truly appreciated.

There was another estimate received to remove all the windows and fill in the spots where the windows were. The cost of that project would be \$13,274.

The money for this purchase was allocated in the 2025 budget.

Glencoe Police Department (GPD) is requesting to purchase a 2015 Ford Explorer with roughly 127,000 miles on it from the McLeod County Sheriff's Office in the amount of \$3750.00. The vehicle was brought to Sam's Tires and evaluated for serviceability. Sam's recommended replacing an axel seal, battery and fluids, in that amount of \$1049.81 total (to include labor). Total amount for squad and to fix issues is \$4799.81.

The money to purchase the vehicle and repairs would come from the Glencoe Police Department Forfeiture account. The account currently has a balance of \$17,040.24. The forfeiture account funds come from vehicles that have been stopped by Glencoe Police Officers and ultimately forfeited because of a criminal offense. Once the owner of the vehicle goes through the legal process and the forfeiture is ordered by the court, the money from the sale of the vehicle is split between GPD, McLeod County Attorney's Office and the State (if drugs are involved). Prior to the money being distributed the City of Glencoe is reimbursed for any expenses they may have incurred, for example towing of the vehicle.

We have used forfeiture money in the past to buy our current SRO squad, computers for squads, radars for squads, lightbars for squads, rifles and repairs to the SRO squad. Purchasing a vehicle is an acceptable use of the forfeiture funds.

The purpose of the vehicle would be to serve as an investigator squad. Currently our investigator is using a marked squad (all squads are marked). The investigator has items that he needs to have available to him and not having an assigned car makes it difficult. The squad wouldn't be identifiable as a squad to allow for ease of incidents in which an unmarked car may be needed.





PROJECT LOCATION MAP









Glencoe Municipal Airport (GYL) has plans for an upcoming Airfield Pavement Maintenance project that includes plans to preserve the condition of runways, taxiways, and aprons. This memo will describe surface treatment options as well as review prospective costs.

PAVEMENT HISTORY AND CONDITION

Runway 13/31, including connector Taxiway A1, was last reconstructed in 2014. The full parallel Taxiway A including connector Taxiways A2, A3, and A4 were constructed in 2015. The apron was last reconstructed in 2015. In 2020, the runway, taxiway, and apron pavements were crack sealed as part of routine pavement maintenance. Additionally in 2020, the hangar area pavement was reconstructed.

Table 1 shows a summary of the Pavement Condition Index (PCI) values provided in the MnDOT 2022 Pavement Condition Report, along with the projected PCI values for 2025. Runway 13/31 covers 253,800 square feet, connecting Taxiway A1 covers 12,275 square feet, connecting Taxiway A2 covers 11,130 square feet, connecting Taxiway A3 covers 10,825 square feet, and parallel Taxiway A (including Taxiway A4) covers 120,420 square feet or surface area. Using the estimated drop in PCI/Yr value from the 2022 MnDOT PCI report, these pavements will be rated between "Good" to "Very Good" condition in 2025. However, recent inspections have noted the emergence of longitudinal and transverse cracking, and weathering on all pavements and some patching on the taxilane pavement.



TREATMENT OPTIONS AND CONSIDERATIONS

To maintain the integrity of asphalt pavements and prevent water and debris intrusion, it is recommended to apply a crack seal treatment every three to five years. Given that the airfield pavement was last sealed in 2020, it is due for another resealing treatment. Mastic treatment would also be beneficial for any cracks that are wider than 2 inches. Specific areas that may be candidates for mastic crack repair can be determined by field inspection.

To address the weathering distresses identified in the MnDOT 2022 Pavement Condition Report, an additional surface treatment can be considered. Surface treatments are done immediately following crack seal treatment and is essential for slowing the oxidation of resins and oils in asphalt pavement and for reducing water permeability. Two treatments are most suitable based the current condition of the pavement: (1) Emulsified Asphalt Slurry Seal Surface Treatment (P-626), and (2) Emulsified Asphalt Seal Coat (P-608). The slurry seal treatment (P-626), with a life expectancy of 5-8 years, is a longer-lasting repair that is spread over the pavement surface and fills existing defects. This makes it a better option for older pavements (over 7 years) with more advanced weathering. It is approved for all airfield pavements at General Aviation (GA) airports serving airplanes weighing 12,500 lbs or less but is most effective on pavements with minimal vehicle turning movements. Therefore, this treatment would be suitable for Runway 13-31, the Parallel Taxiway, and the Taxiway connectors. The seal coat treatment (P-608) is also acceptable for these areas, though its life expectancy is lower at 2-3 years. This treatment is permissible on any airfield pavement. It is generally recommended for newer pavements with minimal wear. Given the condition of the apron and taxilane pavements and considering the higher volume of turning movements made in those areas, the seal coat treatment (P-608) would be more effective for these areas.

Table 2 shows a summary of the treatment options discussed above. See the Airfield Pavement Treatments Table included in the appendix for a complete summary of the potential treatment options allowed by the FAA.

COST

A high-level cost estimate has been prepared for the treatment options outlined above. The estimates shown in Table 3 present the costs for the various options and combinations treatments, including new pavement markings on all areas that would see a surface treatment, defined as follows:

- Base Bid: Crack seal and mastic application on all airfield pavements (no pavement markings)
- Option 1: Slurry seal on the runway (including pavement markings)
- Option 2: Seal coat on the runway (including pavement markings)
- Option 3: Slurry seal on the taxiways (including pavement markings)
- Option 4: Seal coat on the taxiways (including pavement markings)
- Option 5: Seal coat on the apron and taxilanes (including pavement markings)

The estimate breaks down the cost based on funding eligibility. Attached is an exhibit showing the eligibility determination. This is still being reviewed by the FAA. GYL would request that the ineligible portion of the cost be covered under a MnDOT grant at a funding rate of 70% state, 30% local.

AVAILABLE FUNDING

GYL intends to use AIG funding for this pavement maintenance project. During this upcoming Federal Fiscal Year (FFY) 2025, the FAA will cover 95% of the project cost with the remaining 5% split 50/50 between MnDOT (2.5%) and the City of Glencoe (2.5%). GYL's current AIG balance is \$322,961. At the 95% funding rate, this allows for all FY25 project costs to equal \$339,959.

The airport is expecting some of this funding balance to be used for the design of the new taxilane and taxilane extension project (under contract for \$99,400) as well as the design and construction of the fence project (estimated at \$20,000). The design contract for this pavement maintenance project has been approved in the amount of \$26,200. An additional \$40,679 will be needed to cover a portion of the terminal building change order costs. This leaves around \$150,000 of available AIG funding to complete the construction portion of this work.

Based on the cost estimate provided above, and available funding, options are limited. GYL consider crack sealing all pavements and applying a seal coat on the runway or crack sealing all pavements and applying a seal coat on the apron and taxilane areas.

Dear Mark:

As we discussed in our previous meetings, the Hennepin Avenue Project will require the removal of certain trees within the right-of-way. These trees either interfere with the underground utility replacement or are situated too close to the curb, gutter, or sidewalk.

We have conducted a review of the proposed tree removals in collaboration with City and County staff and have also presented the tree removal plan at the open house events held in January. In total, the project requires removal of 47 trees, 17 of which are Ash trees.

There are specific timelines recommended for tree clearing to protect the Northern Long-eared Bat and to address areas infested with the Emerald Ash Borer. To adhere to these timelines, tree clearing should be completed by March 31, 2025.

Attached is the tree removal plan that can be sent to contractors for soliciting quotes. The quotes will strictly cover the tree removal; the grubbing of the stumps will be part of the reconstruction project scheduled for the summer of 2025.

ORDINANCE NO. 627

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF GLENCOE CHARTER

WHEREAS, the Glencoe Charter Commission has made certain recommendations to the City Council pursuant to the provisions of Minnesota Statutes §410.12, Subd. 7, and

WHEREAS, the City Council is disposed to adopt the recommendations of the Charter Commission, and

WHEREAS, the public notice and hearings required by Minnesota Statutes §410.12, Subd. 7 have been complied with.

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GLENCOE ORDAINS:

Section 1:

A. Section 2.05 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.05 <u>Term of Office</u>. The term of office of the Mayor and Council members shall be four years as established by Chapter 646 of Minnesota state code, as amended <u>laws of 1994</u>. The Mayor and the Council members for the first and fourth wards shall be elected together in nongubernatorial year election and the Council member at large and Council members from the second and third wards shall be elected in the gubernatorial year election. The term of office of each officer elected hereunder shall commence at the organizational meeting of the council which is established at the first regular meeting of the City Council after January 1st next following the election in which such officer was elected. All elected officers shall hold office until their successors are elected or appointed and qualified.

B. Section 2.06 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.06 <u>Vacancies</u>. Whenever any vacancy shall occur in any elective office of said City and the remaining term of that elective office is more than two years, such vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the City Council, and such incumbent so appointed shall hold the Council member's office for the unexpired termuntil the next regularly scheduled election, and until the Council member's successor is elected and

qualified. An elected council member's successor shall serve for the remaining two years of the unexpired term of the vacant office. Vacancies in appointive offices shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment was made, and for the unexpired term Any appointment shall be made from the same ward as the original elected office, or in the case of the at-large appointment, from any registered voter of the City. In the case where the remaining term of the vacated elective office is less than two years, then council shall fill said vacant office by appointment under this section for the remainder of the unexpired term. Vacancies in appointive offices shall be filled in the same manner as the original appointment was made.

C. Section 2.07 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.07 Removal. Elective officers may be removed from office in the manner and for the causes provided by Statute and herein. Appointive officers, except commission members, may be removed for cause upon the affirmative vote of the majority of the Council, subject only to any civil service rules or procedures which may be provided. Employees may be discharged according to the policy procedures established by the City Council and amended from time to time. Commission members may be removed only upon the four-fifths vote of the Council. Before any officer or commission member shall be removed, the charges against the officer or commission member shall be reduced to writing and filed with the City Administrator and a copy furnished the accused if the accused can be found within the City. Any accused officer or commission members shall be given a reasonable opportunity to be heard in person, and by counsel, to answer such charges and to present the accused's defense thereto. Continued failure or refusal of any elective or appointive officer to make or file reports required by this Charter or the Statutes shall be adequate cause for removal of such officer. Any officer or commission members so removed shall be removed only after written Findings of Fact are adopted by the Council upon the votes as above described, setting forth specific charges against such officer which the Council has determined to be true and the factual basis for which the Council has found to exist to support such charges.

D. Section 2.09 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.09 <u>Veto Powers.</u> All ordinances and resolutions shall be presented to the Mayor before they take effect. If the Mayor approves such ordinance or resolution the Mayor shall sign the same. Such ordinances and resolutions as the Mayor shall not approve the Mayor shall not sign but shall return to the City Council, by depositing the same with the City Administrator, with the Mayor's objections in writing attached thereto, and which shall be presented to the City Council at their next regular meeting thereafter. Upon the return of any resolution or ordinance not approved by the Mayor the same may be reconsidered, and if after such reconsideration, the Council shall pass the

same by a four-fifths vote of its members, it shall have the same effect as if approved by the Mayor. If any ordinance or resolution shall not be returned to the City Administrator by the Mayor within five business days (Sundays excepted) after it shall have been presented to the Mayor, the same shall have the same effect as if approved by the Mayor.

E. Section 2.10 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.10 <u>Vice President</u>. The Council shall annually, at the organization meeting, elect one council member as Vice President of the Council, who shall act in the place of the Mayor during the Mayor's absence or inability to discharge the Mayor's duties. <u>If the Vice President of the Council is acting in the place of the Mayor at a City Council meeting, then the Vice President shall recuse themself from any votes in case a mayoral tie-breaker vote is necessary under Section 2.08. The Vice President of the Council serving in the place of the Mayor shall not count towards the quorum requirements of Section 3.02.</u>

F. Section 2.14 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 2.14 <u>Incompatible Offices</u>. No member of the Council or the Mayor, shall be appointed to, or shall hold, any paid municipal office or employment under the City; and until one year after expiration of the term as Mayor or Council member, no former member shall be appointed to any appointive office or employment under the City which was created, or for which the compensation is increased, during such individual's term as Mayor or Council member. This <u>section latter provision</u> however shall not apply to a <u>formern ex</u> mayor or <u>councilmemberex alderman</u> serving upon any of the City's commissions, and shall not apply to those current Councilmembers and the Mayor serving upon the City's Economic Development Committee.

G. Section 3.01 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 3.01 <u>General Powers</u>. The legislative power and authority of the City of Glencoe shall be vested in the City Council as provided by this Charter and by the laws and Constitution of the State of Minnesota. The City Council shall have charge of the care, control and supervision of all public streets, alleys, buildings, and grounds of the city, the care and supervision of which are not by this Charter vested in any other board or officer of the city. The City Council, except as in this Charter otherwise provided, shall have the general management and control of the finances and all the property of the city, and shall have full power and authority to make, amend or repeal all such ordinances

or resolutions as it shall deem expedient for the government and good order of the city, for the protection of the public and public health, comfort, and safety, for the suppression of vice and for the prevention of crime. It shall have power and authority to declare and impose penalties and punishments for the violation of ordinances and resolutions and to enforce the same against any person who may violate the same, and all such ordinances and resolutions, not inconsistent with laws and Constitution of this state or of the United States, of this Charter, are hereby declared to have full force and effect as the law of the city. In addition the Council shall have the specific powers as now provided by Minnesota Statutes Annotated Section 411.40, and as the same may hereafter from time to time be amended, together with such other specific powers as are from time to time granted by the Constitution and laws of the State of Minnesota to city councils of cities of the class of the City of Glencoe. The City Council shall have the power and authority, to be exercised by the four fifths vote of the Council, to establish a nursing home and homefor the aged, the establishment and operation of which is hereby specifically declared to be a public purpose. In the event the Council so elects to establish such a home, it shall thereafter be constructed, acquired, operated and maintained by the Glencoe Area Health-Center Commission.

H. Section 4.09 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 4.09 <u>Assessments for Services</u>. The City Council may provide by ordinance that the cost of sprinkling, snow or rubbish removal, or of any other service to streets, sidewalks, or other public property, or the cost of any service, <u>fine or the like</u> to other property undertaken by the City of Glencoe or any of its Boards or Commissions, may be either assessed against the property benefited and collected in like manner as are special assessments or certified to the property taxes of the property benefited and collected in like manner as are property taxes.

I. Section 9.02 of the City of Glencoe Charter shall be amended to read in its entirety as follows:

Section 9.02 <u>Appointment, Qualification and By Whom Made</u>. GLPC shall consist of five members, four of whom shall be <u>registered</u>qualified voters of the <u>Ceity</u> of Glencoe, one member may reside in the GLPC service territory, all must be residential customers of the GLPC and who shall be appointed by the City Council for the terms and the times of herein set forth.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect 90 days following its passage and publication.

Mark Lemen indicated to me that you might be of the understanding that Scott will need to step down from the position on the Planning Commission. The City Council changed the ordinance of all boards and commissions about 10 years ago to allow for the City Council to be represented on all board and commissions, if needed. In some cases, we were not getting enough applications for open board positions.

Below is from the Planning Commission Ordinance:

130.02 Composition. Section 1:

"Such Planning Commission shall consist of five members to be appointed by the City Council and may be removed by 4/5 vote of the Council; the City Engineer and the City Attorney shall be additional members ex officio; the Council may select one member of the Commission from among its own members.

The City Council shall appoint five members to serve upon said commission for terms of variant tenures arranged so that the term of one member shall expire on the first day of January of each year and at its first regular meeting in January of each year, the City Council shall appoint one member to a term of five years to succeed that member whose term expires in such year. No person hereafter appointed to the commission shall serve more than two successive terms thereon...

Scott, let us know if you plan to step down or plan to assume both roles. Currently, we are not soliciting members of the Planning Commission (although, we do have one application received for the Planning Commission).
